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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

HB1568 HD2 HMS 2011-2523

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The efficient and secure movement of 2 agricultural commodities -- whether imported into the State, 3 exported out of the State, or transported between the islands of 4 the State--is key to the long-term viability of Hawaii's 5 agriculture industry. Inefficiencies in cargo transportation 6 increase the cost of goods and raise the risk of spoilage and 7 loss. Consumers and retailers demand safe food products; 8 farmers and wholesalers follow food-safety guidelines and 9 regulations. The transportation of agricultural commodities 10 from producer to consumer cannot be the weak link in the system. 11 The inspection and proper treatment of incoming and 12 outgoing commodities reduce the probability of the introduction 13 of new pests to Hawaii's agricultural industry and reduce the 14 likelihood of a quarantine on Hawaii's exported goods. In 15 addition, export commodities need to be inspected by the United 16 States Department of Agriculture or state department of 17 agriculture to meet the applicable domestic or foreign 18 guarantine or restriction.

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1	Currently, there are only two pathways for introduced						
2	species to arrive in the State: air and sea transportation. Air						
3	transportation has been proven to be the highest risk pathway,						
4	transporting introduced species, invasive species and pests,						
5	various illegal plants and animals, and a higher quantity of						
6	non-native pests, which are more likely to become established in						
7	our islands. Each year, eighty per cent of the insects						
8	intercepted by inspectors are at Hawaii's airports.						
9	The legislature finds that the Federal Aviation						
10	Administration is moving toward a sustainable airport concept						
11	that implements sustainable principles as part of airport						
12	planning, the core principles or which are:						
13	(1) Protecting the environment;						
14	(2) Maintaining high and stable levels of economic growth;						
15	and						
16	(3) Social progress that recognizes all stakeholders'						
17	needs.						
18	This program makes these issues a core objective of the airport						
19	and not a secondary concern.						
20	The purpose of this Act is to initiate and continue the						
21	implementation of biosecurity facilities at Hawaii's ports and

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1	SECTION 2. Chapter 206J, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§206J- Biosecurity and inspection facilities. The
5	development corporation shall provide space, planning and design
6	support, and other infrastructure at the Aloha Tower complex to
7	the department of agriculture for biosecurity and inspection
8	facilities to provide for the inspection, consolidation,
9	deconsolidation, and treatment of agricultural commodities to
10	meet the various needs of Hawaii's agricultural industry."
11	SECTION 3. Chapter 261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
13	and to read as follows:
14	"§261- Biosecurity and inspection facilities. (a) The
15	department shall provide space and other infrastructure at
16	Honolulu International Airport, Hilo International Airport, Kona
17	International Airport at Keahole, Kahului Airport, and Lihue
18	Airport for biosecurity and inspection facilities to provide for
19	the inspection, consolidation, deconsolidation, and treatment of
20	imported and exported agriculture and other inspected
21	commodities to meet the various needs of each island and to

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1	facilitate the safe movement of enplaned and deplaned air cargo
2	through the airport.
3	(b) The department shall design, construct, and operate
4	the biosecurity and inspection facilities at the airports and
5	coordinate with other departments in the planning, design, and
6	operation of these facilities to ensure the effectiveness and
7	efficiency of their operation.
8	(c) The department may charge appropriate rent for the use
9	of the facilities."
10	SECTION 4. Chapter 266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
12	and to read as follows:
13	"266- Biosecurity and inspection facilities. (a) The
14	department of transportation shall provide space, planning and
15	design support, and other infrastructure at Honolulu Harbor,
16	Hilo Harbor, Kawaihae Harbor, Kahului Harbor, and Nawiliwili
17	Harbor to the department of agriculture for biosecurity and
18	inspection facilities to provide for the inspection,
19	consolidation, deconsolidation, and treatment of agricultural
20	commodities to meet the various needs of each island's
21	agricultural industries.

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1	(b) The department of transportation shall design,
2	construct, and operate the biosecurity and inspection facilities
3	at the harbors and coordinate with other departments in the
4	planning, design, and operation of these facilities to ensure
5	the effectiveness and efficiency of their operation.
6	(c) The department of transportation may charge
7	appropriate rent for the use of the facilities."
8	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
9	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
10	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and the
11	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
12	2012-2013 for the department of agriculture to reimburse in full
13	the department of transportation and the Aloha Tower development
14	corporation, as applicable, for their assistance and support to
15	the department of agriculture in establishing biosecurity and
16	inspection facilities at the locations described in sections 2,
17	3, and 4 of this Act.
18	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
19	of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
20	SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
21	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
