H.B. NO. 1569

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognized the importance of 2 reducing the impact of invasive species on Hawaii's agriculture 3 and environment by adopting the biosecurity program, established 4 by Act 236, 2008 Session Laws of Hawaii. Based on the 5 commodities destroyed by the department of agriculture, the 6 legislature found that certain commodities have a higher 7 potential for the transport of invasive species into the State. 8 These commodities were labeled "high risk." One of the actions 9 mandated by the biosecurity program is import replacement, which 10 means reducing the importation of "high risk" commodities by 11 increasing the production of replacement commodities in the 12 State, as stated in section 150A-53(6), Hawaii Revised Statutes. 13 The effect of reducing the amount of imported "high risk" 14 commodities would be to lower the risk of potential invasive 15 species entering the State. This would also allow port 16 inspection resources to focus on other lower risk commodities, thus enhancing the overall effectiveness of inspections at the 17 18 port.



1 Currently, some of these "high risk" commodities or similar 2 commodities are already grown in the State. One important 3 aspect of this effort will be collaboration, not only with the 4 Hawaii department of agriculture and various research 5 institutions, but with farmers and industry. As flowers and 6 produce importation is driven by consumer demand, factors that 7 will need to be considered to maintain a successful program for these locally grown commodities include price, quality, 8 9 consistency, and availability.

10 SECTION 2. The department of agriculture shall develop and implement an import replacement pilot program wherein the 11 12 department shall research, coordinate, and promote the 13 production of certain commodities deemed high risk in the State 14 to reduce the importation of such commodities. The department 15 shall identify the types of commodities that are suitable for 16 replacement and shall assess how to promote the production of 17 such commodities.

18 The chairperson of the board of agriculture shall submit a 19 report on the status of the development and implementation of 20 the import replacement pilot program, including any necessary 21 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty 22 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2012.



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SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$\$\$ or so much
 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 for the
 import replacement pilot program.

5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of6 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July, 1, 2011,
8 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2014.
