A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 302A-624, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§302A-624 Teachers' salary schedule. (a) The salary
4 schedule for all teachers of the department shall be negotiated
5 pursuant to section 89-9.

6	(b)	All teachers shall meet the following requirements:
7	(1)	A teacher shall earn at least five credits within a
8		three-year cycle to receive increment or longevity
9 .		step increases in the third year of the three-year
10		cycle;

11 (2) A teacher who fails to meet the requirement set forth
12 in paragraph (1) shall not be eligible for any
13 increment or longevity step increases until the
14 teacher earns the credit requirement for the three15 year cycle;

16 (3) Any credit earned in excess of any three-year credit
17 requirement may not be carried over beyond the three18 year cycle; and



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1 (4) Credits earned may be in the form of in-service, 2 university, or other credits approved by the 3 department. 4 A teacher shall be required to spend at least one year (C) 5 in Class III before going on to Class IV, at least one year in 6 Class IV before going on to Class V, at least one year in Class 7 V before going on to Class VI, and at least one year in Class VI 8 before going on to Class VII. 9 (d) In case of promotion from a teaching position to an 10 educational officer, the employee shall receive compensation at 11 the lowest step of the higher grade that exceeds the employee's 12 existing compensation by at least eight per cent if such a step 13 exists. 14 Effective retroactively to July 1, 2006, the minimum (e) 15 hourly or minimum per diem rate for substitute teachers shall be 16 [determined by the legislature] as follows; provided that any individual in Class I, II, or III who works less than a full 17 18 seven-hour work day as a substitute teacher or part-time teacher 19 shall be compensated on a pro-rated, hourly basis: 20 Class I: other individuals who do not possess a (1)

21 bachelor's degree shall be compensated at [a rate of
 22 not less than \$125 for a full work day;] an hourly or

13		or licensed or highly qualified teachers, shall be		
14		compensated at [a rate of not less than \$147 for a		
15		full work day.] an hourly or per diem rate that		
16		represents one-hundred and ten per cent of a pro-rated		
17		share of the annual compensation paid for the first		
18		year of work to a licensed teacher with a bachelor's		
19		degree.		
20	(f)	[Effective July 1, 2008, the board shall provide wage		
21	adjustmen	ts for substitute teachers. The wage adjustments shall		
22	be comparable to the across the board wage adjustments for

2	legislative approval, pursuant to section 89C 5.] The board may
3	[also] adjust hours, benefits, and other terms and conditions of
4	employment for substitute teachers.
5	(g) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary,
6	substitute teachers and part-time teachers who worked for the
7	department of education between November 8, 2000, and June 30,
8	2006, who were underpaid by the department of education will be
9	entitled to interest on the underpaid wages pursuant to section
10	<u>478-2.</u> "
