#### **Opposition to HB1651**

My name is H. Thomas Kay, Jr. I am attorney for the Hawaii Coalition Against Legalized Gambling. Two reasons HCALG opposes HB1651 related to shipboard gambling follow:

- 1. The Hawaii tourist industry is in a recovery mode from the substantial losses that occurred in 2008 and 2009 due to the US recession. Discretionary funds from tourists are needed to increase hotel revenue through higher room rates and more days spent in Hawaii. These funds are also necessary to help local businesses and enterprises be profitable as they provide tourists with merchandise, transportation, events, activities, and other services so that their stay in Hawaii is enjoyable and memorable. These discretionary funds from tourists should not be dissipated by losses from shipboard gambling when the tourist industry is dependant upon these funds to provide visitors with quality vacations and still make a profit.
- 2. It would appear that under the Johnson Act, 15USC1176, use of gambling devices on ships leaving or returning to Hawaii is prohibited. Therefore, new Hawaii legislation allowing shipboard gambling would be invalid and illegal under Federal statutes.

The Hawai`i County League of Women Voters strongly opposes HB1651. We question the assumption that shipboard gambling is an enticement that will bring more tourists to Hawai`i. The vast majority of tourists visit to enjoy the weather, the beauty, the outdoor activities, the history. This proposal is no more than a way of squeezing a few more dollars out of a small number of tourists.

Unfortunately, the legalization of shipboard gambling will open the door to the establishment of all forms of gambling.

That pattern of expansion has prevailed across the United States. The downside of other forms of gambling in both social and human terms is not worth the dollars shipboard gambling can provide.
