A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TEACHER STANDARDS BOARD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 302A-801, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 repealed.

3 ["\$302A-801 Hawaii teacher standards board established.

4 (a) There is established the Hawaii teacher standards board,

5 which shall be placed within the department for administrative

6 purposes only. The board shall consist of fifteen members,

7 including not less than six licensed teachers regularly engaged

8 in teaching at the time of the appointment, three educational

officers employed at the time of the appointment, the

10 chairperson of the board of education or the chairperson's

11 designee, the superintendent or the superintendent's designee, a

12 representative of independent schools, the dean of the

13 University of Hawaii college of education or the dean's

designee, and two members of the public; provided that the

15 dean's-designee shall be chosen from the member institutions of

the teacher education coordinating committee established under

17 section 304A-1202.

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| 1 | (b) Except for the chairperson of the board of education, |
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| 2 | superintendent, and dean of the college of education, the |
| 3 | governor shall appoint the members of the board pursuant to |
| 4 | section 26-34, from a list of qualified nominees submitted to |

| 6 | representative of the constituencies of the board, and current |
| 7 | members of the board; provided that the two members of the |
| 8 | public shall be from lists of qualified nominees submitted to |

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         (f) The board may employ an executive director for a term
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    of up to four years, who shall be appointed by the board of
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    education without regard to chapters 76 and 89; provided that
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    the board shall submit a nominee to the board of education for
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    approval or disapproval; provided further that if the nominee is
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    disapproved, the board shall submit another nominee to the board
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    of education for approval or disapproval.
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         The board may terminate the executive director's contract
    for cause; provided that the board shall submit the
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    recommendation for termination to the board of education for
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    approval or disapproval."]
         SECTION 2. Section 302A-802, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    repealed.
         ["$302A-802 Licensing standards; policies. (a) The board
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    shall establish licensing standards that govern teacher
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    licensing in Hawaii. Licensing standards established by the
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    board shall be adopted as rules under chapter 91 unless
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otherwise specified in this subpart.

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| 2 | consider the existing teacher applicant pool that is available |
| 3 | in the State and the level of the qualification of these |
| 4 | applicants, as well as the nature and availability of existing |
| 5 | preservice higher education teacher training programs. |
| 6 | (c) The board shall adopt policies, exempt from chapters |
| 7 | 91 and 92, to initiate the following: |
| 8 | (1) Develop criteria allowing more individuals with trade |
| 9 | or industry experience to teach in vocational, |
| 10 | technical, and career pathway programs, and criteria |
| 11 | for the issuance of permits allowing qualified |
