### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

5	contents.	A mortgagee or movant must:
6	(1)	Provide safe storage of the mortgagor's or tenant's
7		household contents and belongings for a period of not
8		less than ninety days after ejectment by the sheriff;
9	(2)	Obtain a written and notarized release of the tenant's
10		household contents and belongings from the mortgagor
11		or tenant;
12	<u>(3)</u>	Disclose the location of the stored household contents
13		and belongings to the mortgagor or tenant; and
14	(4)	Provide an inventory list of the stored household
15		contents and belongings.
16	<b>§667- Penalties.</b> It will be unlawful to access,	
17	remove, de	estroy, sell, steal, or relocate the household contents

18 and belongings of a tenant without notification to the mortgagor HB HMS 2011-1626

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1	or tenant prior to and during the ninety day period. Mortgagee		
2	or movant may provide storage in an alternative location to the		
3	residence provided an inventory of storage items and costs of		
4	storage are made available to the mortgagor or tenant.		
5	The inventory and costs shall be filed with the bureau of		
6	conveyances or with the court ordering the writ of ejectment.		
7	There will be a penalty of \$5,000 for each offense."		
8	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.		
9	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that		
10	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were		
11	begun before its effective date.
