A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION TO DEFINE MARRIAGE AS BETWEEN A MAN AND A WOMAN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to propose an
amendment to article I, section 23, of the Hawaii Constitution
to define marriage as only between a man and a woman as husband
and wife.

5 The legislature finds that the unique social institution of 6 marriage involving the legal relationship of matrimony between a 7 man and a woman is a protected relationship of fundamental and 8 unequaled importance to the State, the nation, and society. 9 During the 1997 legislative session, H.B. No. 117 was enacted to 10 propose an amendment to the Hawaii Constitution by adding a new 11 section relating to marriage. The proposed amendment was 12 ratified by Hawaii voters in the general election of November 3, 1998, and provides that the legislature "shall have the power to 13 14 reserve marriage to opposite sex couples." Although state law 15 currently provides that a valid marriage contract is only 16 between a man and a woman, a constitutional amendment that 17 expressly limits marriage to a legally sanctioned union only

1	between a man and a woman is necessary to provide further
2	clarification and specificity.
3	SECTION 2. Article 1, section 23, of the Hawaii
4	Constitution is amended to read as follows:
5	"Section 23. [The-legislature shall have the power to
6	reserve marriage to opposite sex couples.] Marriage is a
7	legally sanctioned union only between a man and a woman."
8	SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
9	be as follows:
10	"Shall marriage be defined as a legally sanctioned union
11	only between a man and a woman?"
12	SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is
13	bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is
14	underscored.
15	SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon compliance
16	with article XVII, section 3, of the Hawaii Constitution.
