Description:

Makes moped riders subject to safety equipment requirements. Requires use of helmets in addition to any other protective devices required by rules adopted by the director. Repeals specific requirements relating to use of safety glasses, goggles, or face shields. Makes conforming amendments related to requirements of sellers of protective equipment. Repeals provisions requiring sellers of safety equipment to meet safety specifications adopted by the director of transportation.
