## A BILL FOR AN ACT

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
3	read as follows:
4	" <u>S6E-</u> Plan approval or acceptance. (a) The approval or
5	acceptance of any archaeological inventory survey, mitigation
6	plan, preservation plan, interpretive plan, or other plan or
7	study by the state historic preservation officer shall have no
8	further force or effect after the passage of ten years from the
9	date of the original approval or acceptance.
10	(b) If approval or acceptance of any archaeological
11	inventory survey, mitigation plan, preservation plan,
12	interpretive plan, or other plan or study is a condition
13	precedent for issuance of a permit or other necessary approval
14	for a project and ten or more years has passed from the date of
15	the original approval or acceptance, a new plan or update of the
16	original plan or study shall be prepared for the approval and
17	acceptance of the state historic preservation officer.
