A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LANDFILLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 342H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding three new sections to part I to be 3 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 4 "§342H-A Notice of public hearing. (a) Upon receipt of 5 any application for a permit to construct a new landfill or make a lateral expansion of an existing landfill, the director shall 6 fix a date and give notice for a public hearing of the permit 7 application at least once in each of two consecutive weeks in 8 9 the county where the proposed or existing landfill is located. The date of the hearing shall be not less than forty-five days 10 after the first notice. The notice shall require that all 11 12 protests or objections against the issuance of the permit applied for shall be filed with the director before the date of 13 14 the hearing. Before giving notice, the director shall collect from the 15 16 applicant reimbursement for the cost of giving the public 17 notice.



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1	(b)	Immediately upon the director's fixing a date for the
2	public he	aring, the applicant shall mail a notice setting forth
3	the time	and place of the hearing to each of the following:
4	(1)	Not fewer than two-thirds of the owners and lessees of
5		record of real estate located within a distance of one
6	:	mile from the nearest point of the parcel of land
7		where the new landfill is proposed to be located or
8		from the location of the existing landfill proposed to
9		be expanded. Notice by mail may be addressed to the
10		last known address of the person concerned or to the
11		address as shown in the current real property tax
12		record of the person or the person's agent or
13		representative;
14	(2)	Each condominium project or cooperative apartment
15		located within a distance of one mile from the nearest
16		point of the parcel of land where the new landfill is
17		proposed to be located or from the location of the
18		existing landfill proposed to be expanded; provided
19		that one notice of the hearing shall be sent by mail
20		addressed "To the Residents, In Care of the Manager",
21		followed by the name and address of the condominium or
22		cooperative apartment involved;



1	(3)	The park manager of any public park located within a
2		distance of one mile from the nearest point of the
3		parcel of land where the new landfill is proposed to
4		be located or from the location of the existing
5		landfill proposed to be expanded; and
6	(4)	The principal of any school located within a distance
7		of one mile from the nearest point of the parcel of
8		land where the new landfill is proposed to be located
9		or from the location of the existing landfill proposed
10		to be expanded.
11	The notic	es required under this subsection shall be mailed at
12	least for	ty-five days prior to the date set for the hearing.
13	Before th	e hearing and within seven business days of having
14	mailed th	e notices, the applicant shall file with the director
15	<u>an affida</u>	wit that the notices have been mailed in accordance
16	with this	subsection. In addition to the affidavit, the
17	applicant	shall include both a master list of all the addressees
18	and addre	sses required by paragraphs (1) through (4) and another
19	mailing 1	ist consisting of the portion of addressees and their
20	rèspectiv	e addresses who were mailed the notice to meet the
21	requireme	nts of paragraphs (1) and (2). The director shall make
22	the affid	avit, master list, and mailing list available for
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1	public review upon request. For purposes of this section,
2	"master list" means every owner and lessee or person who would
3	otherwise be required to receive notice of the public hearing
4	according to the requirement of paragraphs (1) through (4), even
5	if they were not actually included in the two-thirds requirement
6	of paragraph (1).
7	If the requirements of this subsection are not met, the
8	director may cancel the hearing or continue the public hearing
9	subject to this section.
10	(c) For purposes of this section:
11	(1) Notice to one co-owner and one co-lessee of real
12	estate shall be sufficient notice to all co-owners and
13	all co-lessees of the affected real estate; and
14	(2) One notice shall be sufficient for an owner or lessee
15	of affected multiple properties; provided that one
16	notice shall be sent to each individual unit of a
17	condominium project or a cooperative apartment as
18	provided in this section.
19	§342H-B Protests. Protests against granting of a permit
20	to construct a new landfill or make an expansion of an existing
21	landfill may be filed with the director by:

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1	(1) Any owner or lessee of real estate situated within a
2	distance of one mile;
3	(2) Any person who resides within a distance of one mile;
4	(3) The park manager of any public park located within a
5	distance of one mile; or
6	(4) The principal of any school located within a distance
7	of one mile,
8	from the nearest point of the parcel of land where the new
9	landfill is proposed to be located or from the location of the
10	existing landfill proposed to be expanded. A protest shall
11	include written statements submitted to the director prior to
12	the hearing and written or oral testimony submitted at the
13	hearing.
14	§342H-C Hearing; consideration of application. (a) On
15	the date of the hearing pursuant to section 342H-A, the director
16	shall consider the permit application and any protests and
17	objections to the granting of the permit and hear the interested
18	parties. The director shall accept all written or oral
19	testimony for or against the application whether the application
20	is denied, refused, or withdrawn. Within ninety days after the
21	hearing, the director shall grant or refuse the application;
22	provided that if a majority of the:

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1	(1)	Owners and lessees of record of real estate situated
2		within a distance of one mile from the nearest point
3		of the parcel of land where the new landfill is
4		proposed to be located or from the location of the
5		existing landfill proposed to be expanded;
6	(2)	Persons who reside within a distance of one mile from
7		the nearest point of the parcel of land where the new
8		landfill is proposed to be located or from the
9		location of the existing landfill proposed to be
10		expanded;
11	(3)	Park managers of any public parks located within a
12		distance of one mile;
13	(4)	Principals of any public schools located within a
14		distance of one mile; or
15	(5)	Any combination of the above,
16	have duly	filed or caused to be filed protests against the
17	granting o	of the permit, or if there appears to be any other
18	disqualif:	ication under this chapter, the permit application
19	shall be o	denied. Otherwise, the director, in the director's
20	discretion	n and in accordance with this chapter, may grant or
21	refuse the	e permit application.



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1	For the purposes of this section, a protest submitted by a		
2	majority of the co-owners or the majority of co-lessees of a		
3	property shall constitute a protest by all the owners or lessees		
4	of record of that property. A protest filed by an owner or		
5	lessee who owns more than one property shall be counted		
6	separately as a protest for each property.		
7	(b) The director shall make available to the applicant and		
8	any protestor for review before the public hearing the list of		
9	those persons who filed a protest or objection to the		
10	application. All applicants and protestors may submit		
11	corrections, additions, or deletions to the master list and the		
12	list of protestors at the public hearing. The director shall		
13	rule on proposed corrections, additions, and deletions and give		
14	reasons for the ruling."		
15	SECTION 2. Section 342H-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
16	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted		
17	and to read as follows:		
18	""Landfill" means a land area used for the disposal of		
19	solid waste."		
20	SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section		
21	1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute		



1 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating

2 the new sections in this Act.

3 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

4 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
