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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 356D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated			
3	and to read as follows:			
4	"§356D- Guests; visitor passes. (a) Visitors on the			
5	premises of a public housing project shall be required to obtain			
6	a visitor's pass from the manager of the public housing project			
7	or the manager's designee upon entering the premises; provided			
8	that a visitor's pass shall only be issued to a person who has			
9	been invited onto the premises by an adult tenant of the public			
10	housing project.			
11	(b) The authority shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91			
12	to effectuate the purposes of this section."			
13	SECTION 2. Section 708-813, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
14	amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:			
15	"(1) A person commits the offense of criminal trespass in			
16	the first degree if:			
17	(a) That person knowingly enters or remains unlawfully:			
18	(i) In a dwelling; or			
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1		(11)	In or upon the premises of a hotel or apartment	
2			building;	
3	(b)	That	person:	
4		(i)	Knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in or upon	
5			premises that are fenced or enclosed in a manner	
6			designed to exclude intruders; and	
7		(ii)	Is in possession of a firearm, as defined in	
8			section 134-1, at the time of the intrusion; $[\frac{1}{2}]$	
9	(c)	That	person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon	
10		the	premises of any public school as defined in	
11		sect	ion 302A-101, or any private school, after	
12		reas	onable warning or request to leave by school	
13		auth	orities or a police officer; provided [ <del>however,</del>	
14		such	] <u>that a</u> warning or request to leave shall be	
15		unne	cessary between 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. <u>; or</u>	
16	<u>(d)</u>	That	person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon	
17		the	premises of any public housing project, as defined	
18		in s	ection 356D-1 or 356D-91, after reasonable warning	
19		<u>or r</u>	equest to leave by housing management or	
20		auth	orities or a police officer."	
21	SEC	rion 3	. (a) The Hawaii public housing authority shall	
22	establish	n a tw	o-year pilot project for Mayor Wright homes. The	
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objective of the pilot project shall be to provide residents of
 Mayor Wright homes with increased safety and security from
 trespassers.

4 (b) The Hawaii public housing authority shall [report]
5 submit a report on the safety and security measures implemented
6 and its findings and recommendations from the pilot project to
7 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
8 of the 2013 regular session.

9 (c) The pilot project shall cease to exist on June 30,10 2013."

SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$\$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the pilot project for Mayor Wright homes.

16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii17 public housing authority for the purposes of this Act.

18 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 19 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 20 begun before its effective date.

21 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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1 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.

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#### Report Title:

Public Housing; Visitor Pass; Trespassing

#### Description:

Requires visitors to public housing projects to receive a visitor's pass upon entrance. Establishes that remaining unlawfully upon the premises after reasonable warning constitutes trespass in the first degree. Establishes a pilot project for increased safety at Mayor Wright Homes. Appropriates funds. Effective January 7, 2059. (HB231 HD2)
