BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Description:

Allows counties to conduct criminal history record checks on certain: (1) Liquor commission employees and prospective employees; (2) Prospective employees working with vulnerable adults or seniors; and (3) Prospective fire, emergency medical services, and emergency management employees. Effective January 7, 2059. (HB268 HD1)

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
