A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to promote and 1 support agriculture by, among other things: 2 3 (1)Establishing the agriculture inspection and certification special fund under the department of 4 5 agriculture; 6 (2)Transmitting certain fees, civil penalties, and moneys 7 collected by the department of agriculture to the 8 agriculture inspection and certification special fund; 9 Allowing the department of agriculture to enter into (3) 10 agreements with government and private agencies to 11 hire inspectors; 12 Transferring all moneys and unpaid obligations of the (4)13 certification services revolving fund on June 30, 14 2011, to the agriculture inspection and certification 15 special fund; and Repealing the certification services revolving fund. 16 (5)

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    Moneys in the fund may be expended for materials, salaries,

- 16 charged for each inspection or certification conducted under
- 17 authority of section 141-4, chapter 144, part I of chapter 145,

- 19 under cooperative agreement with the United States Department of
- 20 Agriculture or other governmental agencies commencing October 1,
- 21 2011, and the fee charged for licensure of or license renewal

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    for a commission merchant, dealer, broker, agent, processor, or

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         SECTION 18. Notwithstanding section 2 of this Act, there
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    is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of
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    Hawaii the sum of $ or so much thereof as may be
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    necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 for the agriculture
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    inspection and certification program of the department of
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    agriculture; provided that funding shall cease when the
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    collection into the agriculture inspection and certification
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special fund becomes sufficient to carry out the purposes of

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this Act.

Agriculture Inspection and Certification; Inspectors

Description:

Establishes the Agriculture Inspection and Certification Special Fund under the Department of Agriculture for the inspection, certification, weighing, or grading of agricultural commodities that are to be imported into, exported from, or shipped within the state. Deposits all fees, civil penalties, and other moneys collected by DOA into the Special Fund. Allows DOA to enter into agreements with government and private agencies to hire and pay inspectors to perform certification and audit services, maintain food safety, and establish and maintain an Internet food safety promotional and reporting system. Repeals the Certification Services Revolving Fund. Requires the establishment or increase of certain fees to cover the operation and maintenance costs of agriculture inspection and certification programs, and central services and departmental administrative expense assessments. Appropriates funds for DOA's agriculture inspection and certification program. (HB290 HD1)
