BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 29-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

3 "§29-14 Boards, [etc., may accept funds, comply]

4 commissions, departments, or officers of the State acceptance of

federal funds; compliance with federal acts. (a) 5 Except as 6 otherwise provided by law, any board, commission, department, or 7 officer of the State may accept and receive, on behalf of the 8 State[, and receipt for], any and all grants or allotments of 9 federal-aid moneys made available to the State by or pursuant to 10 an [act] Act of Congress, and enter into or make such plan, 11 agreement, or other arrangement with the agency designated by the [act] Act of Congress as is necessary to carry out the 12 13 purposes of the Act; provided that if, as a condition [to] of 14 receiving the federal-aid moneys, it is necessary to match all 15 or any part of the grant or allotment with state moneys no plan, 16 agreement, or arrangement may be entered into unless the board, 17 commission, department, or officer has under its or the 18 officer's control moneys which may be expended lawfully for the HB HMS 2011-1178

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purpose[-]; and provided that the board, commission, department, or officer of the State shall notify in writing the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives no later than ten days following receipt of any grant or allotment of federal-aid moneys.

6 (b) The governor may transfer funds from the department of 7 health to the department of human services and from the department of human services, to the department of labor and 8 9 industrial relations to obtain additional federal funds for 10 medical assistance under Title XIX of the Social Security Act, 11 as amended, and the work incentive program. The governor may 12 also transfer funds from one department to another for the 13 purpose of obtaining federal matching grants and allotments; 14 provided that the state moneys have been appropriated for the 15 purpose for which federal grants and allotments may be obtained." 16

17 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

19 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
