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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DISASTER PREPAREDNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	DISASTER PREPAREDNESS
6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
7	"Commission" means the disaster preparedness commission.
8	"Director" means the director of the office of disaster
9	preparedness.
10	"Disaster" means any natural or human-caused catastrophe,
11	the occurrence of which is unanticipated or difficult to
12	predict, that results in significant property damage,
13	agricultural loss, hardship, suffering, psychological or
14	physical injury, or loss of life within the State.
15	"Natural hazard" means hurricane, storm, flood, tsunami,
16	tidal wave, wind-driven water, earthquake, volcanic activity,
17	volcanic smog or vog, lava flow, rockslide, earthslide, fire, or
18	any other naturally occurring emergency.

"Vog" means the substance created when sulfur dioxide and 1 other volcanic gases combine and interact chemically in the 2 atmosphere with oxygen, moisture, dust, and sunlight over a 3 period of time to form a visible haze. 4

-2 Office of disaster preparedness established. 5 S the office There is established in the department of 6 of disaster preparedness. The director of the office of 7 disaster preparedness shall be nominated and with the advice and 8 consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. The director 9 shall serve for a period of six years and thereafter until a 10 successor is appointed. The salary of the director shall be set 11 a year, and shall not be at a rate no greater than \$ 12 diminished during the director's term of office unless by 13 general law applying to all salaried officers of the State. If 14 the director dies, resigns, becomes ineligible to serve, or is 15 removed or suspended from office, the first assistant to the 16 director shall become the acting director until a new director 17 is appointed for a full term. 18

-3 Duties of the director. (a) The director shall 19 S develop a comprehensive disaster preparedness plan for the 20 State. The disaster preparedness plan shall include: 21 The identification of natural hazards;

3	State. The commission's duties in this regard shall include:
4	(1) Gathering information about past disasters that have
5	occurred in the State; and
6	(2) Establishing advisory committees to provide technical
7	and other support to the director."
8	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
9	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
10	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and
11	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
12	year 2012-2013 to establish and operate the office of disaster
13	preparedness and the disaster preparedness commission, including
14	hiring necessary staff.
15	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
16	of for the purposes of this Act.
17	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
