A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC PROCUREMENT CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended b	y adding two new sections to part II to be			
3	appropriately designated and to read as follows:				
4	" <u>§10</u>	3D- Consulting services contracts; annual report.			
5	(a) The	state procurement office shall maintain records			
6	documenti	ng the employment of persons pursuant to contracts for			
7	consultin	g services entered into by state agencies. No later			
8	than one	hundred eighty days after the end of each fiscal year,			
9	the state	procurement office shall submit to the governor and			
10	the legis	lature a report summarizing the following information			
11	for each	state agency:			
12	(1)	The number of contracts entered into for consulting			
13		services during the previous fiscal year;			
14	(2)	The name and address of each contractor;			
15	(3)	The total dollar value of each contract;			
16	(4)	The consulting services performed under each contract;			
17	(5)	Whether competitive bidding was used in awarding each			
18		contract;

3	<u>(7)</u>	The types of services the contract employees provide;

7	(b)	For the purposes of this section, a "contract for			
8	<u>consultin</u>	g services" means any contract that a state agency			
9	enters into for analysis, evaluation, research, training, data				
10	processing, computer programming, engineering, environmental				
11	health and mental health services, accounting, auditing,				
12	paralegal	, legal, or similar services.			
13	<u>(c)</u>	The report required under subsection (a) shall be a			
14	governmen	t record for purposes of disclosure under chapter 92F.			
15	However,	in disclosing the report, the state official or agency			
16	<u>making th</u>	e disclosure shall redact the name and social security			
17	number of	any individual contract employee that is included in			
18	the docum	ent.			
19	<u>(d)</u>	All state agencies shall require all contractors,			
20	including	subcontractors, that provide consulting services for			
21	state pur	poses pursuant to a contract, to submit an annual

2	for each employment category within the contract:				
3	(1) The number of employees employed to provide services				
4	under the contract; and				
5	(2) The number of hours the employees work and the				
6	employees' total compensation under the contract.				
7	Employment reports shall be submitted to the state agency that				
8	awarded the contract and shall be available for public				
9	inspection and copying. However, in disclosing an employment				
10	report, the state agency making the disclosure shall redact the				
11	name and social security number of any individual contract				
12	employee that is included in the document.				
13	<u>§103D-</u> Active procurement contracts; annual report.				
14	(a) The state procurement office shall maintain records				
15	concerning active procurement contracts of more than \$50,000.				
16	No later than one hundred eighty days after the end of each				
17	fiscal year, the state procurement office shall submit to the				
18	governor and the legislature a report that includes the				
19	following information:

(4) For each contract for services:
(A) The number of employees, arranged by employment
category within the contract, employed to provide
services under the contract;
(B) The number of hours the employees work; and
(C) The employees' total compensation under the
contract.
(b) The report required under subsection (a) shall be a
government record for purposes of disclosure pursuant to chapter
92F and shall be available for public inspection and copying.
However, in disclosing the report, the department or the state
official disclosing the report shall redact the name and social
security number of any individual contract employee that is
included in the document."
SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
