A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSTRUCTION SITES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Act 121, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, created a 1 2 construction site inspection task force to analyze the 3 feasibility and potential complications of implementing a task 4 force to investigate and inspect construction sites for 5 unlicensed contractors, undocumented workers, and workplace 6 safety violations, and to submit a report of its findings to the 7 2011 legislature. The task force submitted its report to the 8 legislature in November 2010, including a number of 9 recommendations for further action.

10 In addition, in 2010, the senate committee on economic 11 development and technology and the house committee on economic 12 revitalization, business, and military affairs convened an 13 informal small business discussion group to address the most 14 critical issues facing the small business sectors within 15 Hawaii's economy. Representatives from the Chamber of Commerce 16 of Hawaii, construction and trades industries, community 17 nonprofits, the agricultural sector, food and restaurant 18 industries, retailing, the science and technology sector, the

commercial transportation industry, and interested stakeholders
 developed a package of bills that address the most pressing
 problems facing Hawaii's small business community.

The purpose of this Act is to support the findings of the small business working group by continuing the work of the construction site task force for one year and appropriating funds for the task force to complete any further recommended actions.

9 SECTION 2. Act 121, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, is
10 amended by amending section 3 to read as follows:

11 "SECTION 3. The construction site inspection task force 12 shall submit [a] an initial report to the legislature no later 13 than sixty days before the commencement of the 2011 regular 14 session on its findings and recommendations on implementing a 15 task force to investigate and inspect construction sites for 16 unlicensed contractors, undocumented workers, and workplace 17 safety violations. The report shall include but not be limited 18 to:

19 (1) The scope of potential cases of violations and
20 noncompliance with tax laws that could be identified,
21 audited, investigated, prosecuted through civil
22 action, or referred for criminal prosecution;
