# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
- 2 for the biennial budget of the office of Hawaiian affairs. This
- 3 Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Office of Hawaiian
- 4 Affairs Appropriations Act of 2011".
- 5 SECTION 2. Unless otherwise clear from the context, as
- 6 used in this Act:
- 7 "Program ID" means the unique identifier of the specific
- 8 program, and consists of the abbreviation for the office of
- 9 Hawaiian affairs followed by a designated number for the
- 10 program.
- "Means of financing", or "MOF", means the source from which
- 12 funds are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, to be
- 13 expended for the programs and projects specified in this Act.
- 14 Letter symbols following appropriations have the following
- 15 meanings:
- 16 A: General Funds
- 17 T: Trust Funds

Program activities are to be 12 designed to optimize learning for Hawaiian students and are 13 intended to develop a stronger interest in learning, connect 14 learning and education to one's Hawaiian identity, and explore 15 possible educational, career, and academic goals the students 16 may not have considered; provided further that notwithstanding 17 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended 18 for the purposes of this section shall be in accordance with 19 chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate. 20 SECTION 7. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 21 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$524,400 in general 22 funds and \$524,400 in trust funds for fiscal year 2011-2012 and

- 1 the sum of \$524,400 in general funds and \$524,400 in trust funds
- 2 for fiscal year 2012-2013 shall provide legal services and legal
- 3 representation to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries for:
- 4 the assertion and defense of quiet title actions; assistance
- 5 with ahupua'a and kuleana tenant rights, including rights of
- 6 access and rights to water; land title assistance, including
- 7 review of title and genealogy; preservation of traditional and
- 8 customary practices; protection of culturally significant
- 9 places; and preservation of native Hawaiian land trust
- 10 entitlements; provided further that notwithstanding section 10-
- 11 17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended for the
- 12 purposes of this section shall be in accordance with chapter
- 13 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate.
- 14 SECTION 8. Provided that whenever the need arises, the
- 15 board of trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs or their
- 16 designee is authorized to transfer sufficient funds and
- 17 positions between programs for operating purposes; provided
- 18 further that these transfers shall not be inconsistent with
- 19 legislative intent; and provided further that a report of these
- 20 fund transfers shall be made to the legislature no later than
- 21 thirty days prior to the convening of the 2012 and 2013 regular
- 22 sessions.



- 1 SECTION 9. If any portion of this Act or its application 2 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any
- 3 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall
- 4 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
- 5 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
- 6 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to
- 7 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the
- 8 extent possible.
- 9 SECTION 10. In the event manifest clerical, typographical,
- 10 or other mechanical errors are found in this Act, the board of
- 11 trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs is hereby authorized
- 12 to correct such errors. All changes made pursuant to this
- 13 section shall be reported to the legislature at its next
- 14 session.
- 15 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
