A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
 for the biennial budget of the office of Hawaiian affairs. This
 Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Office of Hawaiian
 Affairs Appropriations Act of 2011".

5 SECTION 2. Unless otherwise clear from the context, as
6 used in this Act:

7 "Program ID" means the unique identifier of the specific
8 program, and consists of the abbreviation for the office of
9 Hawaiian affairs followed by a designated number for the
10 program.

II "Means of financing", or "MOF", means the source from which
I2 funds are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, to be
I3 expended for the programs and projects specified in this Act.
I4 Letter symbols following appropriations have the following
I5 meanings:

16 A: General Funds

17 T: Trust Funds



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"Position ceiling" means the maximum number of permanent
 positions authorized for a particular program during a specified
 period or periods, as noted by an asterisk.

4 SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may 5 be necessary to accomplish the purposes and programs designated 6 herein, are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, from 7 the sources of funding specified to the office of Hawaiian 8 affairs for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2011 and 9 ending June 30, 2013. The total general fund expenditures and the number of permanent positions established in each fiscal 10 11 year of the biennium shall not exceed the sums and the position 12 ceiling indicated for each year, except as provided elsewhere in 13 this Act.

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SECTION 4. Provided that the general fund appropriations
 in section 3 of this Act shall be expended by the office of
 Hawaiian affairs.

4 SECTION 5. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 5 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$415,000 in general 6 funds and \$415,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2011-2012 and 7 the sum of \$415,000 in general funds and \$415,000 in trust funds 8 for fiscal year 2012-2013 shall provide for social services to 9 office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries to include information 10 and referral services, case management and counseling, establishment of individual development accounts, financial 11 12 literacy, and financial assistance. Referral services include 13 those relating to education assistance, employment and income 14 security, individual and family care, health needs, housing, 15 legal services, genealogy research, business assistance, and 16 general information; provided further that notwithstanding 17 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended 18 for the purposes of this section shall be in accordance with 19 chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate. 20 SECTION 6. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 21 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$615,570 in general 22 funds and \$615,570 in trust funds for fiscal year 2011-2012 and

1 the sum of \$615,570 in general funds and \$615,570 in trust funds 2 for fiscal year 2012-2013 shall provide for educational 3 enrichment programs for native Hawaiian children in grades K 4 through 12 throughout the State. Program activities are to be 5 designed to optimize learning for Hawaiian students and are 6 intended to develop a stronger interest in learning, connect 7 learning and education to one's Hawaiian identity, and explore 8 possible educational, career, and academic goals the students 9 may not have considered; provided further that notwithstanding 10 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended 11 for the purposes of this section shall be in accordance with 12 chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate. 13 SECTION 7. Provided that of the funds appropriated for beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$524,400 in general 14 15 funds and \$524,400 in trust funds for fiscal year 2011-2012 and 16 the sum of \$524,400 in general funds and \$524,400 in trust funds for fiscal year 2012-2013 shall provide legal services and legal 17 18 representation to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries for: 19 the assertion and defense of quiet title actions; assistance 20 with ahupua'a and kuleana tenant rights, including rights of 21 access and rights to water; land title assistance, including review of title and genealogy; preservation of traditional and 22



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customary practices; protection of culturally significant
 places; and preservation of native Hawaiian land trust
 entitlements; provided further that notwithstanding section 10 17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended for the
 purposes of this section shall be in accordance with chapter
 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate.

7 SECTION 8. Provided that whenever the need arises, the 8 board of trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs or their 9 designee is authorized to transfer sufficient funds and 10 positions between programs for operating purposes; provided 11 further that these transfers shall not be inconsistent with 12 legislative intent; and provided further that a report of these 13 fund transfers shall be made to the legislature no later than 14 the end of the 2012 and 2013 fiscal years.

15 SECTION 9. If any portion of this Act or its application 16 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any 17 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall 18 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is 19 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall 20 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to 21 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the 22 extent possible.



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SECTION 10. In the event manifest clerical, typographical,
 or other mechanical errors are found in this Act, the board of
 trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs is hereby authorized
 to correct such errors. All changes made pursuant to this
 section shall be reported to the legislature at its next
 session.

SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
