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#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 431, article 10A, Hawaii Revised

9	repairs to motorized wheelchairs and electronic convenience

11	(1) The motorized wheelchair or electronic convenience			
12	vehicle is medically necessary; and			
13	(2) The motorized wheelchair or electronic convenience			
14	vehicle is prescribed by a health care professional			
15	authorized to prescribe such a device."			
16	SECTION 2. Chapter 431, article 10A, Hawaii Revised			
17	Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part II to be			
18	appropriately designated and to read as follows:			
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1	(1)	The motorized wheelchair or electronic convenience	
2		vehicle is medically necessary; and
