A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) Notwithstanding the requirement of a
- 2 referring concurrent resolution pursuant to section 26H-6,
- 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the auditor shall analyze the necessity
- 4 and impact of a proposed mandate to include coverage of on-call
- 5 motorized wheelchair service and repair, and loaners or rentals
- 6 while repairs are being made, under each policy of accident and
- 7 health or sickness insurance, providing coverage for health
- 8 care, including long-term care, that is issued in this State.
- 9 The auditor shall analyze the impact of such a mandate on
- 10 Medicaid, Medicare and private insurance agencies, and consider
- 11 alternatives to the proposed mandate, as appropriate.
- 12 (b) The auditor shall submit a report of its findings and
- 13 recommendations, including proposed necessary legislation, to
- 14 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 15 of the 2012 regular session.
- 16 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
