A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WHISTLEBLOWERS' PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that public employees may
- 2 possess information about improper activities such as waste,
- 3 fraud, and misconduct occurring in state and local government,
- 4 but may not report the information because of fear of
- 5 retaliation by their supervisors. Greater protection for public
- 6 employees is necessary to encourage them to come forward with
- 7 information that will help ensure the efficiency and integrity
- 8 of state and local government.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to provide additional protection
- 10 to public employees who report violations of the law and other
- 11 improper activities.
- 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 78, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 13 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 "§78- Whistleblowers; notice. (a) Upon receipt of any
- 16 complaint made pursuant to section 378- , the department of
- 17 labor and industrial relations shall inform the complainant of
- 18 the complainant's rights under the law.

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         (b) The department of labor and industrial relations shall
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    prescribe the content and the posting of notices pertaining to
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    the application of section 378- ."
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         SECTION 3. Chapter 378, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by designating sections 378-61 to 378-69, Hawaii Revised
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    Statutes, as subpart A and adding a title before section 378-61,
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    Hawaii Revised Statutes, to read as follows:
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                         "A. GENERAL PROVISIONS"
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         SECTION 4. Chapter 378, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by adding a new subpart to part V to be appropriately
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    designated and to read as follows:
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                         " . PUBLIC EMPLOYEES
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         §378- Protected disclosure by a public employee. (a)
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    In addition to any other protections under this chapter, a
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    public employer shall not discharge, threaten, or otherwise
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    discriminate against a public employee regarding the public
    employee's compensation, terms, conditions, location, or
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    privileges of employment because the public employee, or a
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    person acting on behalf of the public employee, reports or is
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    about to report to the public employer or a public body,
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    verbally or in writing:
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1	<u>(1)</u>	Any violation or suspected violation of a federal,
2		state, or county law, rule, ordinance, or regulation;
3	(2)	Any violation or suspected violation of a contract
4		executed by the State, a political subdivision of the
5		State, or the United States; or
6	<u>(3)</u>	Any condition that may significantly threaten the
7		health or safety of the public or the public employee;
8		provided that the disclosure is made for the purpose
9		of remedying the condition;
10	unless the employee knows that the report is false.	
11	(b)	Every public employer shall post notices pertaining to
12	the appli	cation of section 378- , as shall be prescribed by the
13	departmen	t of labor and industrial relations, in conspicuous
14	places in every workplace.	
15	(c) For purposes of this section:	
16	"Public employee" means any employee of the State or any	
17	county, or the political subdivision and agencies of the State	
18	or any county, any employee under contract with the State or any	
19	county, any civil service employee, any probationary or	
20	provisional employee of the State or county, and any employee of	
21	any genera	al contractor or subcontractor undertaking the

- 1 execution of a contract with a governmental contracting agency,
- **2** as defined in section 104-1.
- 3 "Public employer" means the State and any county, the
- 4 political subdivisions and agencies of the State and any county,
- 5 and any general contractor or subcontractor undertaking the
- 6 execution of a contract with a governmental contracting agency,
- 7 as defined in section 104-1, and includes any agent thereof."
- 8 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.
