A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TORTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 663-1.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "\$663-1.5 Exception to liability. (a) Any person who in
4 good faith renders emergency care, without remuneration or
5 expectation of remuneration, at the scene of an accident or
6 emergency to a victim of the accident or emergency shall not be
7 liable for any civil damages resulting from the person's acts or
8 omissions, except for such damages as may result from the
9 person's gross negligence or wanton acts or omissions.

. 10 (b) No act or omission of any rescue team or physician 11 working in direct communication with a rescue team operating in 12 conjunction with a hospital or an authorized emergency vehicle 13 of the hospital or the State or county, while attempting to 14 resuscitate any person who is in immediate danger of loss of life, shall impose any liability upon the rescue team, the 15 16 physicians, or the owners or operators of such hospital or 17 authorized emergency vehicle, if good faith is exercised.

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1 This section shall not relieve the owners or operators of 2 the hospital or authorized emergency vehicle of any other duty 3 imposed upon them by law for the designation and training of 4 members of a rescue team or for any provisions regarding 5 maintenance of equipment to be used by the rescue team or any 6 damages resulting from gross negligence or wanton acts or 7 omissions.

8 (c) Any physician or physician assistant licensed to 9 practice under the laws of this State or any other state who in 10 good faith renders emergency medical care in a hospital to a 11 person, who is in immediate danger of loss of life, without 12 remuneration or expectation of remuneration, shall not be liable 13 for any civil damages, if the physician or physician assistant 14 exercises that standard of care expected of similar physicians 15 or physician assistants under similar circumstances. Any 16 physician who supervises a physician assistant providing 17 emergency medical care pursuant to this section shall not be required to meet the requirements set forth in chapter 453 18 19 regarding supervising physicians.

20 (d) Any person or other entity who as a public service
 21 publishes written general first aid information dealing with
 22 emergency first aid treatment, without remuneration or
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expectation of remuneration for providing this public service,
 shall not be liable for any civil damages resulting from the
 written publication of such first aid information except as may
 result from its gross negligence or wanton acts or omissions.

5 Any person who in good faith, without remuneration or (e) expectation of remuneration, attempts to resuscitate a person in 6 7 immediate danger of loss of life when administering any 8 automated external defibrillator, regardless of where the 9 automated external defibrillator that is used is located, shall not be liable for any civil damages resulting from any act or 10 omission except as may result from the person's gross negligence 11 12 or wanton acts or omissions.

13 Any person, including an employer, who provides for an automated external defibrillator or an automated external 14 15 defibrillator training program shall not be vicariously liable for any civil damages resulting from any act or omission of the 16 17 persons or employees who, in good faith and without remuneration or the expectation of remuneration, attempt to resuscitate a 18 person in immediate danger of loss of life by administering an 19 automated external defibrillator, except as may result from a 20 21 person's or employer's gross negligence or wanton acts or 22 omissions.



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1	(f) Any physician or physician assistant who administers
2	an automated external defibrillator program without remuneration
3	or expectation of remuneration shall not be liable for any civil
4	damages resulting from any act or omission involving the use of
5	an automated external defibrillator, except as may result from
6	the physician's or physician assistant's gross negligence or
7	wanton acts or omissions.
8	(g) An owner of, or person in lawful possession of,
9	agricultural lands shall not be liable for any civil damages
10	resulting from any act or omission upon their agricultural lands
11	if the injured party is found to have committed the offense of
12	criminal trespass in the second degree pursuant to section 708-
13	814 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.
14	[(g)] (h) This section shall not relieve any person,
15	physician, physician assistant, or employer of:
16	(1) Any other duty imposed by law regarding the
17	designation and training of persons or employees;
18	(2) Any other duty imposed by provisions regarding the
19	maintenance of equipment to be used for resuscitation;
20	or
21	(3) Liability for any damages resulting from gross
22	negligence, or wanton acts or omissions.

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1 [(h)] (i) For the purposes of this section: 2 "Automated external defibrillator program" means an 3 appropriate training course that includes cardiopulmonary 4 resuscitation and proficiency in the use of an automated 5 external defibrillator. 6 "Good faith" includes but is not limited to a reasonable 7 opinion that the immediacy of the situation is such that the 8 rendering of care should not be postponed. 9 "Rescue team" means a special group of physicians, basic 10 life support personnel, advanced life support personnel, 11 surgeons, nurses, volunteers, or employees of the owners or 12 operators of the hospital or authorized emergency vehicle who 13 have been trained in basic or advanced life support and have 14 been designated by the owners or operators of the hospital or 15 authorized emergency vehicle to attempt to provide such support and resuscitate persons who are in immediate danger of loss of 16 17 life in cases of emergency." 18 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 20 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
