A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended					
2	by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately					
3	designated and to read as follows:					
4	"S11-A Automatic registration. (a) Any person who					
5	properly completes an application for a new or renewed driver's					
6	license, provisional license, instructional permit, or state					
7	identification card, and who is eligible to vote under this					
8	part, shall be registered to vote as provided in subsection (c).					
9	(b) The examiner of drivers of each county and the					
10	attorney general shall use application forms for an original,					
11	duplicate, or change of address driver's license, provisional					
12	license, instructional permit, or state identification card that					
13	may also serve as voter registration applications. The forms					
14	must contain spaces for all information collected by voter					
15	registration applications as required by section 11-15(a). The					
16	examiner of drivers of each county and the attorney general					
17	shall transmit the information to the clerk of the county in					
18	which the applicant resides.					

1	(c) The clerk shall determine whether the applicant is					
2	currently registered in the general county register. If the					
3	applicant is not currently registered, the clerk shall determine					
4	whether the applicant is eighteen years of age or older and a					
5	citizen of the United States. If the applicant is less than					
6	eighteen years of age, the clerk shall wait until the applicant					
7	has turned eighteen years of age to determine whether the					
8	applicant is eligible to vote. Upon determination that the					
9	applicant is eligible to vote, the clerk shall number the					
10	applicant's voter information and register the name of the voter					
11	in the general county register as provided in section 11-15."					
12	SECTION 2. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
13	amended by adding a new section to part VI to be appropriately					
14	designated and to read as follows:					
15	" <u>§286-A</u> Voter registration. (a) A qualified applicant					
16	for a motor vehicle driver's license, provisional license, or					
17	instructional permit shall be registered to vote with the clerk					
18	of the appropriate county upon completion of an application for					
19	a driver's license, provisional license, or instructional permit					
20	as required in section 11-A.					
21	(b) Every qualified applicant identified in subsection (a)					
22	shall be required to authorize the examiner of drivers to

1	collect and transmit the necessary personal information required				
2	for registering the qualified applicant with the county clerk.				
3	The examiner of drivers shall notify all qualified applicants				
4	identified in subsection (a) that by submitting an application				
5	for a driver's license, provisional license, or instructional				
6	permit, the qualified applicant is consenting to registration to				
7	vote with the county clerk.				
8	(c) For the purposes of this section, "qualified				
9	applicant" means a person who qualifies to register as a voter				
10	pursuant to section 11-15."				
11	SECTION 3. Chapter 846, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
12	amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately				
13	designated and to read as follows:				
14	"§846-A Voter registration. (a) A qualified applicant				
15	for a certificate of identification shall be registered to vote				
16	with the clerk of the appropriate county upon completion of an				
17	application for a certificate of identification as required in				
18	section 11-A.				
19	(b) Every qualified applicant identified in subsection (a)				
20	shall be required to authorize the attorney general to collect				
21	and transmit the necessary personal information required for				
22	registering the qualified applicant with the county clerk. The

1	attorney general shall notify all qualified applicants					
2	identified in subsection (a) that by submitting an application					
3	for a certificate of identification, the qualified applicant is					
4	consenting to registration to vote with the county clerk.					
5	(c) For the purposes of this section, "qualified					
6	applicant" means a person who qualifies to register as a voter					
7	pursuant to section 11-15."					
8	SECTION 4. Section 286-108, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
9	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:					
10	"(a)	Except as provided in section 286-107.5(a), the				
11	examiner	of drivers shall examine every applicant for a driver's				
12	license, except as otherwise provided in this part. The					
13	examination shall include a test of:					
14	(1)	The applicant's eyesight and any further physical				
15		examination that the examiner of drivers finds				
16		necessary to determine the applicant's fitness to				
17		operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways;				
18	(2)	The applicant's ability to understand highway signs				
19		regulating, warning, and directing traffic;				
20	(3)	The applicant's knowledge of the rules of the road				
21		based on the traffic laws of the State and the traffic				
22		ordinances of the county where the applicant resides

1	or intends to operate a motor vehicle; provided that					
2	the examination shall specifically test the					
3	applicant's knowledge of the provisions of section					
4	291C-121.5; and					
5	(4) The actual demonstration of ability to exercise					
6	ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a					
7	motor vehicle.					
8	The examinations shall be appropriate to the operation of the					
9	category of motor vehicle for which the applicant seeks to be					
10	licensed and shall be conducted as required by the director.					
11	The examiner of drivers shall require every applicant to					
12	comply with section 286-102.5.					
13	The examiner of drivers may waive the actual demonstration					
14	of ability to operate a motorcycle or motor scooter for any					
15	person who furnishes evidence, to the satisfaction of the					
16	examiner of drivers, that the person has completed the					
17	motorcycle education course approved by the director in					
18	accordance with section 431:10G-104.					
19	[At the time of examination, an application for voter					
20	registration by mail shall be made available to every applicant					
21	for a driver's license.]

1 For the purposes of this section, the term "applicant" does 2 not include any person reactivating a license under section 3 286-107.5(a)." SECTION 5. Section 846-35, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 5 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 6 "(a) [All] Except as provided in section 846-A, 7 information and records acquired by the department of the 8 attorney general under this part shall be confidential. All 9 information and records shall be maintained in an appropriate 10 form and in an appropriate office in the custody and under the 11 control of the department, which shall at all times be kept 12 separate from any similar records relating to the identification 13 of criminals. The information shall be available only to 14 authorized persons in the department, and such other persons or 15 agencies as the attorney general shall authorize, under such 16 restrictions as the attorney general shall prescribe. The 17 attorney general may dispose of any application or certificate of registration, or information or record relating to such 18 19 application or certificate of registration, which does not 20 include a social security number, without regard to the 21 provisions of chapter 94, whenever, in the attorney general's

1 discretion, retention of such information or record is no longer 2 required or practicable." 3 SECTION 6. In codifying the new sections added by sections 1, 2, and 3 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall 4 5 substitute appropriate section numbers for the letters used in 6 designating the new sections in this Act. 7 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2012. 9 10 Hal Mhad
