A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending the definitions of "consumer fireworks" and
 "cultural" to read as follows:

4 ""Consumer fireworks" means any fireworks designed 5 primarily for retail sale to the public [during authorized dates 6 and times,] that produces visible or audible effects by 7 combustion, and that is designed to remain on or near the ground 8 and, while stationary or spinning rapidly on or near the ground, 9 emits smoke, a shower of colored sparks, whistling effects, 10 flitter sparks, or balls of colored sparks, and includes 11 combination items that contain one or more of these effects. 12 "Consumer fireworks" shall comply with the construction, 13 chemical composition, and labeling regulations of the United 14 States Consumer Product Safety Commission as set forth in Title 15 16 Code of Federal Regulations and fireworks classified as 16 UN0336 and UN0337 by the United States Department of 17 Transportation as set forth in Title 49 Code of Federal 18 Regulations. "Consumer fireworks" include firework items HB LRB 11-0404.doc

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1 commonly known as firecrackers that are single paper cylinders 2 not exceeding one and one-half inches in length excluding the 3 fuse and one-quarter of an inch in diameter and contain a charge 4 of not more than fifty milligrams of pyrotechnic composition, 5 snakes, sparklers, fountains, and cylindrical or cone fountains 6 that emit effects up to a height not greater than twelve feet 7 above the ground, illuminating torches, bamboo cannons, 8 whistles, toy smoke devices, wheels, and ground spinners that 9 when ignited remain within a circle with a radius of twelve feet 10 as measured from the point where the item was placed and 11 ignited, novelty or trick items, combination items, and other fireworks of like construction that are designed to produce the 12 13 same or similar effects.

14 "Cultural" means relating to the arts, customs, traditions, 15 mores, and history of all of the various groups of Hawaii[-] and 16 includes religious events."

SECTION 2. Section 132D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, isamended to read as follows:

19 "\$132D-3 [Permissible uses] Use of consumer fireworks[-];
20 prohibition; exception. [Consumer fireworks may be] It shall be
21 unlawful for any person to set off, [ignited, discharged,]

5	pursuant to section 132D-10, it shall be unlawful to purchase or			
6	possess consumer fireworks [more than five calendar days-before			
7	the time periods for permissible use under section 132D-3.]			
8	within the State.			
9	(c) [It] <u>Except for use at cultural events by permit</u>			
10	pursuant to section 132D-10, it shall be unlawful to offer,			
11	expose for sale, sell, or furnish consumer fireworks [after			
12	12:01-a.m. on New Year's-Day,-6:00 p.m. on Chinese New Year's			
13	Day, and 8:00 p.m. on the Fourth of July.] to any person within			
14	the State. Any person in possession of consumer fireworks			
15	valued at \$50 or more shall be presumed to have intended to			
16	offer or expose the fireworks for sale.			
17	Any person violating this subsection shall be guilty of a			
18	misdemeanor."			
19	SECTION 4. Section 132D-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
20	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:			
21	"(c) It shall be unlawful for any licensee, other than a			
22	wholesaler who is selling or transferring fireworks or articles			
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1 pyrotechnic to a licensed retailer, to sell or offer to sell, 2 exchange for consideration, give, transfer, or donate any 3 · fireworks or articles pyrotechnic at any time to any person who 4 does not present a permit duly issued as required by section 132D-10 or 132D-16. The permit shall be signed by the seller or 5 6 transferor at the time of sale or transfer of the fireworks or 7 articles pyrotechnic, and the seller or transferor shall 8 indicate on the permit the amount and type of fireworks or articles pyrotechnic sold or transferred. No person shall sell 9 10 or deliver fireworks to any permittee in any amount in excess of 11 the amount specified in the permit, less the amount shown on the permit to have been previously purchased[; provided that no 12 13 fireworks shall be sold to a permittee holding a permit issued 14 for purposes of section 132D-3, more than five calendar days 15 before the applicable-time-period under-section-132D-3]." 16 SECTION 5. Section 132D-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended to read as follows:

18 "\$132D-9 Application for permit. The permit required 19 under section 132D-10 or 132D-16 shall be issued by the county 20 or its authorized designees and be nontransferable. The county 21 or its authorized designees shall issue all permits for which 22 complete applications have been submitted and which contain only



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1 correct information. The permit shall specify the date of 2 issuance or effect and the date of expiration but in no case for 3 a period to exceed one year. [The permit for the purchase of 4 consumer fireworks for the purposes of section 132D-3 shall not 5 allow-purchase for more-than-one event as set forth in section 6 132D-3.] The application shall be made on a form setting forth the dates for which the permit shall be valid, the location 7 8 where the permitted activity is to occur, and the name of the 9 proprietor or, if a partnership, the name of the partnership and 10 the names of all partners or, if a corporation, the name of the 11 corporation and the names of its officers. The permit 12 application may be denied if the proposed use of fireworks or 13 articles pyrotechnic presents a substantial inconvenience to the 14 public or presents an unreasonable fire or safety hazard. Any 15 permit issued pursuant to this chapter shall be prominently 16 displayed in public view at the site."

SECTION 6. Section 132D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, isamended to read as follows:

19 "\$132D-10 Permits[-] for purchase or use of fireworks;
 20 fees. A permit shall be required for the purchase and use of:

12	SECT	ION 7. Section 132D-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended to	o read as follows:

15	shall be t	unlawful for any person to offer for sale, sell, or
16	give any :	fireworks or articles pyrotechnic to minors, and for
17	any minor	to possess, purchase, sell, or set off, ignite, or
18	otherwise cause to explode any fireworks or articles	
19	pyrotechn:	ic[, except-as-provided in section 132D-13]."
20	SECT	ION 8. Section 132D-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	repealed.	



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1	[" §132D-13 Liability of parents or guardians. The
2	parents, guardian, and other persons having the custody or
3	control of any minor, who knowingly permit the minor to possess,
4	purchase, or set off, ignite, or otherwise cause to explode any
5	fireworks or articles pyrotechnic, shall be deemed to be in
6	violation of this chapter and shall be subject to the penalties
7	thereunder, except that the parents or guardian may allow the
8	minor to use consumer fireworks while under the immediate
9	supervision and control of the parent or guardian, or under the
10	supervision and control of another adult."]
11	SECTION 9. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
12	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
13	begun, before its effective date.
14	SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
