### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that auditor report no. 1 10-06, Audit of the Department of Public Safety, Sheriff 2 Division, dated June 2010, found several operational 3 deficiencies with the sheriff division of the department of 4 public safety. 5 The purpose of this Act is to protect the public safety and 6 security by ensuring that these deficiencies are corrected 7 effectively and efficiently. 8

9 SECTION 2. Section 353C-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended to read as follows:

11 "\$353C-2 Director of public safety; powers and duties.
12 [+] (a) [+] The director of public safety shall administer the
13 public safety programs of the department of public safety and
14 shall be responsible for the formulation and implementation of
15 state goals and objectives for correctional and law enforcement
16 programs, including ensuring that correctional facilities and
17 correctional services meet the present and future needs of

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1	persons c	ommitted to the correctional facilities. In the
2	administr	ation of these programs, the director [ <del>may</del> ]:
3	(1)	[ <del>Preserve</del> ] Shall preserve the public peace, prevent
4		crime, detect and arrest offenders against the law,
5		protect the rights of persons and property, and
6		enforce and prevent violation of all laws and
7		administrative rules of the State as the director
8		deems to be necessary or desirable [ <del>or upon-request,</del>
9		to assist other-state officers or-agencies that have
10		primary administrative responsibility over specific
11	• •	<pre>subject matters or programs];</pre>
12	(2)	Upon request and at the director's discretion, assist
13		other state officers or agencies that have primary
14		administrative responsibility over specific subject
15		matters or programs;
16	[-(2)	Train,] (3) Shall train, equip, maintain, and
17		supervise the force of public safety officers,
18		including law enforcement and correctional personnel,
19		and other employees of the department;
20	[ <del>-(3)</del> -	<u>Serve] (4)</u> Shall serve process both in civil and
21		criminal proceedings;

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1	[ <del>(4) Perform</del> ] <u>(5)</u> <u>Shall perform</u> other duties as may be			
2	required by law;			
3	[ <del>(5) Adopt,</del> ] <u>(6)</u> <u>Shall adopt</u> pursuant to chapter 91, rules			
4	that are necessary or desirable for the administration			
5	of public safety programs; and			
6	[ <del>(6) Enter</del> ] <u>(7)</u> <u>Shall enter</u> into contracts in behalf of			
7	the department and take all actions deemed necessary			
8	and appropriate for the proper and efficient			
9	administration of the department.			
10	[+](b)[+] The department of public safety shall report to			
11	the legislature not later than twenty days prior to the			
12	commencement of the 2008 regular session, and every session			
13	thereafter, with its achievements, continuing improvements, and			
-14	ongoing problems in providing the appropriate mental health care			
15	to committed persons under its jurisdiction."			
16	SECTION 3. (a) The department of public safety shall			
17	develop and implement a comprehensive strategic plan to correct			
18	the deficiencies in the sheriff division that were reported in			
19	Auditor Report No. 10-06, Audit of the Department of Public			
20	Safety, Sheriff Division, dated June 2010. The plan shall,			
21	among other things:			



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1	(1)	Purs	ue accreditation for the sheriff division from the		
2		Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement			
3		Agen	cies, Inc. to ensure that proper law enforcement		
4		poli	cies and procedures are enacted and followed; and		
5	(2)	Correct inefficiencies in the warrant process,			
6		incl	uding:		
7		(A)	Reducing the backlog of warrants to be served by		
8			the sheriff division;		
9		(B)	Improving the sheriff division's radio system to		
10			provide adequate and reliable communications		
11			coverage for on-duty officers in line with		
12			applicable law enforcement standards of the		
13	-		Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement		
14			Agencies, Inc.; and		
15		(C)	Relocating the receiving desk from Halawa		
16			correctional facility to address the problem of		
17			having to process a defendant in one location and		
18			retrieve warrants from another location miles		
19			away, and to facilitate the process applicable to		
20			persons who are voluntarily turning themselves		
21			in; and		

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Address departmental leadership concerns by, among 1 (3)other things, developing and implementing internal 2 controls, in accordance with the Committee of 3 Sponsoring Organizations of the Treadway Commission's 4 internal control-integrated framework, to provide 5 assurance of effectiveness and efficiency of sheriff 6 division operations in meeting the division's goals 7 and objectives. 8 In conjunction with the comprehensive strategic plan, 9 (b) the department shall, among other things: 10 Perform a risk assessment of each section of the 11 (1)sheriff division that, at a minimum, meets the 12 requirements of Act 100, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, 13 and propose statutory amendments to align the duties 14 and functions of the department and the sheriff 15 division with the findings of the risk assessment; and 16 Adopt rules for the sheriff division, pursuant to 17 (2)chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that are 18 necessary to enable the sheriff's division to fulfill 19 its duties and functions. 20

(c) The departments of public safety and transportation
shall address the concerns raised by the auditor in Auditor



1 Report No. 10-06, dated June 2010, relating to the provision of 2 security for the State's airports under the jurisdiction of the 3 department of transportation. This includes concerns regarding 4 the provision of deputy sheriffs to neighbor island airports, 5 the autonomy of the sheriff division's airports section, and the 6 ability of the sheriff division's airports section to respond to 7 emergencies outside the airport area.

No later than twenty days prior to the convening of 8 (d) the regular session of 2012, the department of public safety 9 shall submit to the legislature a report on how it has corrected 10 the deficiencies pointed out in the Auditor Report No. 10-06 and 11 this section. The report shall include, among other things, a 12 13 status report of the department's actions to correct the deficiencies, the department of public safety's comprehensive 14 strategic plan, and the department's findings and 15 recommendations on the scope of functions of the department of 16 public safety, including recommended statutory amendments to be 17 enacted in the regular session of 2012. The report shall 18 include information required by Act 100, Session Laws of Hawaii 19 1999, regarding the inclusion of a statement of goals, how each 20 goal will be accomplished, an action plan with an implementation 21



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timetable, and a process to measure the performance of the
 programs and services.

There is appropriated out of the general 3 SECTION 4. revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 4 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and 5 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 6 year 2012-2013 for the sheriff's division for purposes of this 7 Act; provided that none of the moneys appropriated shall be used 8 for the corrections division or for administrative expenses of 9 the department of public safety. 10

11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department12 of public safety for the purposes of this Act.

13 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

15 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;16 provided that section 4 shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
