A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Auditor Report No.
 10-06, Audit of the Department of Public Safety, Sheriff
 Division, dated June 2010, found several operational
 deficiencies with the sheriff division of the department of
 public safety.

6 The purpose of this Act is to protect the public safety and
7 security by ensuring that these deficiencies are corrected
8 effectively and efficiently.

9 SECTION 2. Section 353C-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended to read as follows:

11 "\$353C-2 Director of public safety; powers and duties.
12 [+](a)[+] The director [of public safety] shall administer the
13 public safety programs of the department [of public safety] and
14 shall be responsible for the formulation and implementation of
15 state goals and objectives for correctional and law enforcement
16 programs, including ensuring that correctional facilities and
17 correctional services meet the present and future needs of

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1	persons committed to the correctional facilities. In the				
2	administration of these programs, the director [may]:				
3	(1)	[Preserve] <u>Shall preserve</u> the public peace, prevent			
4		crime, detect and arrest offenders against the law,			
5		protect the rights of persons and property, and			
6		enforce and prevent violation of all laws and			
7		administrative rules of the State as the director			
8		deems to be necessary or desirable [or upon request,			
9		to assist other state officers or agencies that have			
10		primary-administrative responsibility over specific			
11		<pre>subject matters or programs];</pre>			
12	(2)	May, upon request, assist other state officers or			
13		agencies that have primary administrative			
14		responsibility over specific subject matters or			
15		programs;			
16	[·(2)	Train,] (3) Shall train, equip, maintain, and			
17		supervise the force of public safety officers,			
18		including law enforcement and correctional personnel,			
19		and other employees of the department;			
20	[(3)	Serve] (4) Shall serve process [both] in both civil			
21		and criminal proceedings;			

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1 [(4) Perform] (5) Shall perform other duties as may be 2 required by law; 3 [(5) Adopt,] (6) Shall adopt pursuant to chapter 91, rules 4 that are necessary or desirable for the administration 5 of public safety programs; and 6 [(6)] Enter] (7) Shall enter into contracts [in] on behalf 7 of the department and take all actions deemed 8 necessary and appropriate for the proper and efficient 9 administration of the department. [+](b)[+] The department [of public safety] shall report to 10 11 the legislature not later than twenty days prior to the 12 [commencement] convening of the 2008 regular session, and every 13 session thereafter, with its achievements, continuing 14 improvements, and ongoing problems in providing the appropriate 15 mental health care to committed persons under its jurisdiction." 16 SECTION 3. (a) The department of public safety shall 17 develop and implement a comprehensive strategic plan to correct 18 the deficiencies in the sheriff division that were reported in Auditor Report No. 10-06, Audit of the Department of Public 19 Safety, Sheriff Division, dated June 2010. The plan shall, 20 21 among other things:

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1	(1)	Purs	ue accreditation for the sheriff division from the	
2		Comm	ission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement	
3		Agen	cies, Inc. to ensure that proper law enforcement	
4		poli	cies and procedures are enacted and followed;	
5	(2)	Corr	ect inefficiencies in the warrant process,	
6		including:		
7		(A)	Reducing the backlog of warrants to be served by	
8			the sheriff division;	
9		(B)	Improving the sheriff division's radio system to	
10			provide adequate and reliable communications	
11			coverage for on-duty officers in line with	
12			applicable law enforcement standards of the	
13			Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement	
14			Agencies, Inc.; and	
15		(C)	Relocating the receiving desk from Halawa	
16			correctional facility to address the problem of	
17			having to process a defendant in one location and	
18			retrieve warrants from another location miles	
19			away, and to facilitate the process applicable to	
20			persons who are voluntarily turning themselves	
21			in;	
22		and		

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1 Address departmental leadership concerns by, among (3) other things, developing and implementing internal 2 3 controls, in accordance with the Committee of 4 Sponsoring Organizations of the Treadway Commission's 5 internal control-integrated framework, to provide 6 assurance of effectiveness and efficiency of sheriff 7 division operations in meeting the division's goals 8 and objectives. 9 (b) In conjunction with the comprehensive strategic plan, 10 the department shall, among other things: Perform a risk assessment of each section of the 11 (1)12 sheriff division that, at a minimum, meets the 13 requirements of Act 100, Session Laws of Hawaii 1999, 14 and propose statutory amendments to align the duties 15 and functions of the department and the sheriff division with the findings of the risk assessment; and 16 17 (2)Adopt rules for the sheriff division, pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that are 18 19 necessary to enable the sheriff division to fulfill 20 its duties and functions.

(c) The departments of public safety and transportation
shall address the concerns raised by the auditor in Auditor

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Report No. 10-06, dated June 2010, relating to the provision of security for the State's airports under the jurisdiction of the department of transportation. This includes concerns regarding the provision of deputy sheriffs to neighbor island airports, the autonomy of the sheriff division's airports section, and the ability of the sheriff division's airports section to respond to emergencies outside the airport area.

8 (d) No later than twenty days prior to the convening of 9 the regular session of 2012, the department of public safety 10 shall submit to the legislature a report that includes a 11 strategic plan on how it has corrected, or plans to correct, the 12 deficiencies pointed out in Auditor Report No. 10-06 and this 13 section. The report shall include, among other things:

14 (1) A status report of the department of public safety's
15 actions to correct the deficiencies or plan to correct
16 the deficiencies;

17 (2) The department of public safety's comprehensive18 strategic plan;

19 (3) The cost allocations necessary to meet the goals of20 the strategic plan; and

(4) The department of public safety's findings and
 recommendations on the scope of functions of the

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1 department of public safety, including recommended 2 statutory amendments to be enacted in the regular 3 session of 2012. 4 The report shall also include the cost of each strategic goal, 5 and information required in part II of Act 100, Session Laws of 6 Hawaii 1999, regarding the inclusion of a statement of goals, 7 how each goal will be accomplished, an action plan with an 8 implementation timetable, and a process to measure the 9 performance of the programs and services. 10 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
