A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL ASSISTANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately		
3	designated and to read as follows:		
4	"§346- Medical assistance; noncitizens. (a) The		
5	department shall provide covered noncitizens with medical		
6	assistance for the following services:		
7	(1) Dialysis and chemotherapy and other cancer treatment	<u>.s</u>	
8	that are medically necessary, as that term is		
9	described in section 432E-1.4;		
10	(2) At least ten physician inpatient and twelve physicia	an	
11	outpatient visits for each benefit year. Medical		
12	assistance under this paragraph shall not include		
13	visits for dialysis or chemotherapy treatments under	r	
14	paragraph (1); and		
15	(3) At least eight drug prescriptions per month;		
16	provided that medical assistance shall not be provided if the		
17	penefits mandated under this section are replaced by benefits		

18 provided under federal law.



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1	<u>(b)</u>	As used in this section, "covered noncitizen" means a
2	<u>legal res</u>	ident of Hawaii, age nineteen or older, who:
3	(1)	Is not a United States citizen;
4	(2)	Is a legal permanent resident who arrived on or after
5		August 22, 1996;
6	(3)	Would, as a citizen of the United States, be eligible
7		for benefits under the State's medicaid programs,
8		including QUEST; and
9	(4)	Is not eligible for federally funded medical
10		assistance due to restricted eligibility rules imposed
11		by Title XXI of the Social Security Act, the Personal
12		Responsibility and Work Reconciliation Act of 1996, or
13		the Compact of Free Association Act of 1985, P.L. 99-
14		239, the Compact of Free Association between the
15		United States and the Government of Palau, P.L. 99-
16		658, or any other provision of federal law denying
17		medical assistance to non-immigrants who are citizens
18		of the Republic of the Marshall Islands, the Federated
19		States of Micronesia, or the Republic of Palau."
20	SECTI	ION 2. Section 432E-1.4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended by	amending subsection (a) to read as follows:



"(a) For contractual purposes, a health intervention shall 1 be covered if it is an otherwise covered category of service, 2 not specifically excluded, recommended by the treating licensed 3 health care provider, and determined by the health plan's 4 medical director to be medically necessary as [defined] 5 described in subsection (b). A health intervention may be 6 medically indicated and not qualify as a covered benefit or meet 7 that definition of medical necessity. A managed care plan may 8 9 choose to cover health interventions that do not meet the 10 definition of medical necessity." 11 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 for 14 medical assistance for covered noncitizens. 15

15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 16 human services for the purposes of this Act.

17 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2012;
provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2011.

Medical Assistance; Noncitizens; Pacific Islanders

Description:

Requires the Department of Human Services to provide medical assistance for dialysis, chemotherapy, and other cancer treatments, inpatient and outpatient physician visits, and drug prescriptions for immigrants and noncitizens from the Republic of the Marshall Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia, or the Republic of Palau. Effective January 1, 2012.

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
