A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 302A-321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[f]\$302A-321[f] Standards-based curriculum. (a) When
4 developing a standards-based curriculum and implementing it in a
5 school or complex, at the minimum, the curriculum shall:

- 6 (1) Be specific in its standards-based scope and sequence
- 7 over a school year for each grade level and course;
- 8 (2) Be consistent in course content;
- 9 (3) Be aligned across all grade levels;
- 10 (4) Specifically address the state content and performance11 standards and related benchmark maps; and
- 12 (5) Be implemented in all appropriate classrooms in the13 school or complex.

14 (b) School complexes may choose to develop an articulated
15 and aligned K-12 standards-based curriculum in one or more of
16 the following core content areas:

17 (1) Language arts;

18 (2) Mathematics;



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1 (3)	Science;	and
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2 (4) Social studies.

3 (c) School complexes shall provide professional

4 development.

5 (d) School complexes that develop a standards-based
6 curriculum shall use standards-based formative assessment tools
7 to monitor student progress, not less than on a quarterly basis
8 throughout the school year.

9 (e) School complexes shall develop rigorous classroom-10 based performance assessments.

(f) School complexes may implement software programs at the school level to help to align school course material with Hawaii content and performance and federal educational

14 standards.

(g) School complexes shall develop and implement college
 entrance examination preparation courses for standardized
 college admissions examinations for all students in grade levels

18 nine through twelve and shall require the students to obtain

19 credit for completion of the courses prior to graduation

20 beginning with the 2012-2013 school year."
