A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WILDLIFE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is important to preserve, protect, and conserve Hawaii's wildlife. 2 The department of land and natural resources, under chapter 183D, 3 4 Hawaii Revised Statutes, is authorized to manage and administer the wildlife and wildlife resources of the State, including 5 6 enforcing laws relating to protecting, taking, hunting, killing, 7 propagating, or increasing the wildlife within the State.

8 Body crushing traps are devices used mainly for the lethal 9 trapping of small game mammals. Originally intended to be an 10 "instant killing" device, body crushing traps are designed to 11 snap shut in a scissor-like fashion on an animal's spinal column 12 at the base of the skull. Foot and leg-hold traps spring closed 13 when an animal steps on them. Because it is impossible to control the size, species, and direction of the animal entering 14 15 the traps, many animals do not die quickly when trapped, and 16 instead endure prolonged suffering and eventual death.

17 A study released in 1997 by the International Association 18 of Fish and Wildlife Agencies confirmed that a body crushing 2011-0476 HB SMA-1.doc

trap often does not kill trapped animals instantly, and the trap 1 2 is often cited as a device that causes inhumane treatment and 3 cruelty to animals. Domestic animals are frequent victims of 4 body crushing traps, and there are numerous reported cases of 5 dogs and cats found dead or severely injured after being caught 6 in these devices. Since existing laws and administrative rules 7 do not prohibit or regulate the use of body crushing traps or 8 snares, both are easily purchased on the Internet.

9 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the use of body 10 crushing traps, snares, and non-padded or non-laminated foot or 11 leg-hold traps, regulate the use of snares and foot or leg-hold 12 traps, and establish penalties for violations.

13 SECTION 2. Chapter 183D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
15 and to read as follows:

16 "<u>§183D-</u> Wildlife; body crushing traps; foot or leg-hold
17 traps; snares; prohibited activities; penalties. (a) No person
18 shall knowingly, intentionally, or recklessly use, set, or
19 maintain:

- 20 (1) <u>A body crushing trap;</u>
- 21 (2) A foot or leg-hold trap that is not padded or
- 22
- laminated; or



1	(3)	A snare in an area zoned as residential or any other
2		area prohibited by law or rule, to hunt, capture, or
3		kill any animal.
4	<u>(b)</u>	Any person using a snare or padded or laminated foot
5	or leg-ho	ld trap to hunt, capture, or kill any animal shall:
6	(1)	Possess a valid hunting license or permit issued by
7		the department, or written authorization issued by the
8		board, and shall attend any training required by the
9		department and abide by all rules adopted pursuant to
10	,	this section;
11	(2)	Have a metal identification tag, affixed at all times
12		during use, to the snare or foot or leg-hold trap with
13		the person's name and contact phone number; and
14	(3)	Check the snare or foot or leg-hold trap a minimum of
15		once every twenty-four hours once the trap is set and,
16	•	upon request, present written documentation to the
17		department verifying when and by whom the snare or
18		trap was checked.
19	(c)	Any dog or cat captured using any snare or foot, leg-
20	hold, or	body crushing trap shall be immediately checked for
21 identification and reported to the designated county animal

2	<u>designate</u>	d animal control contractor.	
3	<u>(d)</u>	Exemptions:	
4	(1)	This section shall not apply to state or federal	
5		agencies acting pursuant to a mandatory statutory duty	
6		for the protection of species listed as threatened or	
7		endangered, or other wildlife species protected by	
8		law;	
9	(2)	Subsection (b)(3) shall not apply to state, federal,	
10		or private conservation agencies trapping feral or	
11		injurious species in remote areas for conservation	
12		purposes; provided that the agency first obtains a	
13		written waiver of the twenty-four hour snare and trap	
14		check requirement from the department stating the	
15		grounds for the waiver and the new time interval	
16		within which the snare or foot or leg-hold trap shall	
17		be checked; and	
18	(3)	This section shall not apply to accepted practices for	
19		rodent control.	
20	<u>(e)</u>	Any person violating this section or any rule adopted	
21	pursuant	to this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor under	
22	section 183D-5(b).		
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1	(f) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter			
2	91 to carry out the purposes of this section."			
3	SECTION 3. Section 183D-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
4	amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately			
5	inserted and to read as follows:			
6	""Body crushing trap" means a contrivance consisting of			
7	metal or steel, other than a snare or foot or leg-hold trap,			
8	designed to kill by crushing the body or severing the spinal			
9	cord of any animal, including game, game birds, game mammals,			
10	predators, wild birds, wildlife, or wild mammals.			
11	"Foot or leg-hold trap" means a contrivance consisting of			
12	metal or steel which is designed to capture and hold any animal			
13	including game, game birds, game mammals, predators, wild birds,			
14	wildlife, or wild mammals, by a foot or limb.			
15	"Snare" means a contrivance consisting of a noose,			
16	regardless of material, designed to capture, trap, or kill any			
17	animal, including game, game birds, game mammals, predators,			
18	wild birds, wildlife, or wild mammals."			
19	SECTION 4. Section 183D-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
20	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:			
21	"(b) Any person violating section 183D-25.5, 183D-26,			
22	183D-27, 183D-32, 183D-62, [or] 183D-64 <u>, or 183D-</u> shall be			
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1	guilty of	a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be
2	punished	as follows:
3	(1)	For a first conviction by a mandatory fine of not less
4		than \$200, or by imprisonment of not more than one
5		year, or both;
6	(2)	For a second conviction within five years of a
7		previous conviction, by a mandatory fine of not less
8		than \$1,000, or by imprisonment of not more than one
9		year, or both, and all firearms, snares, or traps used
10		in the commission of such violations shall be
11		considered contraband to be forfeited to and disposed
12		of by the State; and
13	(3)	For a third or subsequent conviction within five years
14		of the first two or more convictions, by a mandatory
15		fine of not less than \$2,000, or by imprisonment of
16		not more than one year, or both, and all firearms,
17		snares, or traps used in the commission of such
18		violations shall be considered contraband to be
19		forfeited to and disposed of by the State."
20	SECT	ION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
21	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
22	begun bef	ore its effective date.
