A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NUCLEAR ENERGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that despite the availability of locally based alternative energy sources, Hawaii remains dependent on imported fossil fuels for eighty per cent of its energy generation. As a result, electric rates in Hawaii are one hundred to two hundred per cent higher than the national average and the local economy is highly susceptible to volatile external energy market forces.

8 The legislature finds that nuclear energy is a safe and 9 efficient alternative to fossil fuels and that nuclear power 10 generation facilities already exist in Hawaii in the form of the United States Navy's nuclear-powered vessels berthed at Pearl 11 12 Harbor. Many areas throughout the continental United States, 13 Europe, and Asia produce electricity with nuclear energy. 14 France, for example, has constructed fifty-eight nuclear power 15 facilities that generate nearly ninety per cent of the country's 16 electricity. Just as in these other areas, the opportunity exists in Hawaii to safely use nuclear energy to generate 17

1	electricity and substantially reduce the State's dependence on		
2	expensive imported fossil fuels.		
3	The purpose of this Act is to direct the department of		
4	business, economic development, and tourism to develop the		
5	proposed legislation and rules necessary to establish an		
6	appropriate permitting process to enable the construction and		
7	operation of nuclear energy generation facilities in Hawaii.		
8	SECTION 2. Chapter 196, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
10	and to read as follows:		
11	" <u>§</u> 19	6- Nuclear energy generation facilities. (a) No	
12	later than January 1, 2014, the department shall develop		
13	procedures for licensing, siting, and permitting the		
14	construction and operation of nuclear energy generation		
15	facilities in the State. These procedures shall take into		
16	account:		
17	(1)	The requirements of article XI; section 8 of the	
18		Constitution of the State of Hawaii;	
19	(2)	The health and safety of the residents of the State;	
20	(3)	Compliance with the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974

3	(5)	The preservation and conservation of the natural

5	(b)	The department shall develop procedures for the	
6	disposal,	storage, or reprocessing of radioactive waste material	
7	produced	in nuclear energy generation facilities in the State.	
8	(c)	The department shall seek input and recommendations	
9	from othe	r county, state, and federal agencies in the	
10	development of procedures under this section.		
11	(d)	The director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91	
12	necessary	for the implementation of this section.	
13	<u>(e)</u>	As used in this section:	
14	"Dep	artment" means the department of business, economic	
15	developme	nt, and tourism.	
16	<u>"Dir</u>	ector" means the director of business, economic	
17	development, and tourism.		
18	"Nuc	lear energy generation facility" or "facility" means a	
19	new nuclear fission power plant or facility located in the State		
20	with the	capacity to produce from nuclear fissile material at	
21	<u>least two</u>	hundred megawatts of electricity. The term includes

3	(1)	The land parcel on which the facility is situated;	
4	<u>(2)</u>	Any nuclear energy production structure or equipment;	
5	(3)	Any energy transmission line from the facility to a

7		distribution system;	
8	(4)	Any on-site infrastructure; and	
9	(5)	Any on-site building, structure, other improvement, or	
10		equipment necessary for the production of electricity,	
11		transmission of the electricity, or any accommodation

13	SECTION 3. The department of business, economic		
14	development, and tourism shall issue progress reports to the		
15	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of		
16	the regular sessions of 2012 and 2013, and a final report to the		
17	legislature of its findings, recommendations, proposed		
18	legislation, and proposed rules no later than twenty days prior		
19	to convening of the regular session of 2014.		
20	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.		



SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
