A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a special fund needs 2 to be established for the state fire council for administration 3 of the reduced ignition propensity cigarette program. Money for 4 the fund should come from the fees collected by the state fire 5 council under the program as provided for in section 132C-4, 6 Hawaii Revised Statutes. Since the program's implementation on 7 September 30, 2009, approximately \$390,000 has been collected. 8 The special fund will be used to, among other things, fund staff 9 positions within the state fire council for an administrator and 10 an assistant to execute the statutory duties of the program. 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 132C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

13 and to read as follows:

14 "<u>\$132C-</u> <u>Reduced ignition propensity cigarette program</u>
15 <u>special fund.</u> (a) There is established in the state treasury a
