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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state fire 2 council needs to employ an administrator and an assistant to 3 administer, enforce, inspect, and provide oversight for the 4 reduced ignition propensity cigarette program under chapter 5 132C, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The fees collected pursuant to 6 the reduced ignition propensity cigarette program are intended 7 to be used by the state fire council, are renewable every three 8 years, and since the program was implemented on September 30, 9 2009, amount to nearly \$370,000.

10 The purpose of this Act is to create a reduced ignition 11 propensity cigarette special fund to assist the state fire 12 council in carrying out its statutory duties.

13 SECTION 2. Chapter 132C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 15 and to read as follows:

17 <u>special fund.</u> (a) There is established in the state treasury

5	(b)	Moneys in the reduced ignition propensity cigarette	
6	program s	pecial fund shall be administered and expended by the	
7	state fire council to defray the actual cost of activities and		
8	requireme	nts of section 132C-4, including employing one full-	
9	time admi	nistrator and one full-time assistant whose duties	
10	shall inc	lude:	
11	(1)	Adopting administrative rules for program	
12		implementation, establishing compliance inspections,	
13		and approving forms and enforcement procedures and	
14		guidelines;	
15	(2)	Receiving certifications for approximately six hundred	
16		different brands and styles of cigarettes from the	
17		manufacturers;	
18	(3)	Compiling a list of the cigarette brands and styles	
19		for which manufacturers have submitted certifications,	
20		verifying tax stamp compliance with the department of	
21		the attorney general, and posting the list of	



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1		certified brands and styles on a state website for	
2		informational purposes only;	
3	(4)	Reviewing and approving, as needed, any alternative	
4		test methods or fire standard compliance markings	
5		submitted by the manufacturer; and	
6	<u>(5)</u>	If needed, submitting certified cigarettes to an	
7		accredited laboratory for testing to verify that	
8		performance standards have been met."	
9	SECT	ION 3. Section 132C-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
10	amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as		
11	follows:

13	(a) Each	manufacturer shall submit to the state fire council	
14	written c	ertification attesting that each cigarette has been	
15	tested in	accordance with, and has met the performance standard	
16	required	under section 132C-3. The description of each	
17	cigarette	listed in the certification shall include:	
18	(1)	The brand or trade name on the package;	
19	(2)	Style, such as light or ultra light;	
20	(3)	Length in millimeters;	
21	(4)	Circumference in millimeters;	
22	(5)	Flavor, such as menthol, if applicable;	
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1	(6)	Filter or nonfilter;
2	(7)	Package description, such as a soft pack or box;
3	(8)	The mark approved pursuant to subsection (b);
4	(9)	The name, address, and telephone number of the
5		laboratory, if different than the manufacturer that
6		conducted the test; and
7	(10)	The date that the testing occurred.
8	Each	cigarette certified under this subsection shall be
9	recertifi	ed every three years. For each cigarette listed in a
10	certifica	tion, a manufacturer shall pay to the state fire
11	council a	\$375 fee. The state fire council is authorized to
12	annually	adjust this fee to ensure it defrays the actual costs
13	of the <u>ad</u>	ministration and staffing requirements and processing,
14	testing,	enforcement, inspection, and oversight activities
15	required 1	by this chapter.
16	The	certifications shall be made available to the attorney
17	general f	or purposes consistent with this chapter."

20	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.

Fire Protection; Reduced Ignition Propensity Cigarette Program Special Fund

Description:

Establishes the Reduced Ignition Propensity Cigarette Program Special Fund to be funded by fees collected from cigarette manufacturers to administer and provide staff for the Reduced Ignition Propensity Cigarette Program. Authorizes the State Fire Council to employ administrative staff. Authorizes the State Fire Council to adjust fees. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB605 HD2)

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
