## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD CUSTODY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 571, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§571- Visitation by electronic communication. (a) A		
5	award of	visitation rights to a parent may provide for	
6	visitatio	n by electronic communication.	
7	(b)	In awarding visitation by electronic communication, a	
8	court shall consider:		
9	(1)	Whether visitation by electronic communication is in	
10		the best interest of the child, which shall be	
11		determined by application of the criteria set out in	
12		section 571-46;	
13	(2)	Whether the equipment necessary for electronic	
14		communication is available, accessible, and affordable	
15		to the parents of the child; and	
16	<u>(3)</u>	Any other factors the court deems appropriate in	
17		determining whether to grant visitation by electronic	
18		communication.	

1	(c)	In awarding visitation by electronic communication,
2	the court	may set guidelines, including the hours during which
3	the commu	nication may take place, the allocation of costs
4	between t	he parents in implementing electronic communication
5	with the	child, and the furnishing of access information between
6	parents n	ecessary to facilitate electronic communication.
7	<u>(d)</u>	Electronic communication may be used to supplement
8	visitatio	n with the child.
9	(e)	Electronic communication shall not be used to:
10	(1)	Replace or substitute custody or visitation, except
11		where the parent seeking visitation by electronic
12		communication is unable to participate in physical
13		visitation due to circumstances including military
14		deployment; or
15	(2)	Justify or support the relocation of a parent.
16	<u>(f)</u>	Visitation by electronic communication between the
17	child and	the parent may be subject to supervision as ordered by
18	the court	<u>·</u> "
19	SECT	ION 2. Section 571-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	amended b	y adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
21	and to read as follows:

""Electronic communication" means communication that is

facilitated by any wired or wireless technology via the Internet

or any other electronic media, including but not limited to

communication by telephone, electronic mail, instant messaging,

video conferencing, and web camera."

SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
