### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NOXIOUS WEEDS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 152-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
3	and to read as follows:
4	"Board" means the board of agriculture."
5	SECTION 2. Section 152-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"§152-4 Designation of noxious weed. (a) The department
8	may designate certain plant species as noxious weeds following
9	the criteria and procedures established under section 152-2(1).
10	(b) The board may designate certain plant species as
11	noxious weeds following the criteria and procedures established
12	under sections 152-A.
13	(c) The department and the board shall publish and [make
14	available a list provide their respective lists of noxious
15	weeds to interested persons."
16	SECTION 3. Chapter 152, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended by adding 7 new sections to be appropriately designated
18	and to read as follows:

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1	" <u>§</u> 15	2-A Criteria and procedure for the designation of
2	noxious w	eed by the board for eradication or control projects by
3	the depar	tment. The board may designate any plant species as a
4	<u>noxious w</u>	eed to be eradicated or controlled by the department,
5	pursuant	to all of the criteria in section 152-B through 152-F,
6	and the p	rocedure in section 152-G.
7	<u>§152</u>	-B Criteria based on plant reproduction.
8	Reproduct	ive characteristics of noxious weeds are plant species
9	that:	
10	(1)	Reproduce by seeds capable of being dispersed over a
11		wide area;
12	(2)	Reproduce by seeds capable of remaining dormant for
13		more than one year; or
14	(3)	Reproduce by roots or other natural vegetative means.
15	<u>§152</u>	-C Criteria based on growth characteristics.
16	Growth ch	aracteristics of noxious weeds are plant species that:
17	(1)	Are capable of competing with cultivated crops for
18		nutrients, water or sunlight; or
19	(2)	Form dense stands in pasture lands, forests, lawns,
20		landscape gardens, and recreational areas and
21		conservation districts and is capable of shading and



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1		crowding out forage plants, native plants, and other
2		desirable plants.
3	<u>§152</u>	-D Criteria based on detrimental effects.
4	Detriment	al effects of noxious weeds are plant species that:
5	(1)	Cause or have the potential to cause severe production
6	,	losses or control costs to any industry;
7	(2)	Endanger or have the potential to endanger native
8		flora and fauna by encroachment;
9	(3)	Hamper or have the potential to hamper the full
10		utilization of recreational areas; or
11	(4)	Are poisonous, injurious, or otherwise harmful to
12		humans, animals, or other plant life.
13	<u>§152</u>	-E Criteria based on control. Control criteria of
14	noxious w	eeds include plant species that are:
.15	(1)	Not effectively controlled by present day technology
16		or by available herbicides currently registered for
17		use pursuant to chapter 149A;
18	(2)	Effectively controlled only by extraordinary efforts
19		such as repeated herbicidal applications at high
20		dosage rates; or
21	(3)	Effectively controlled only by additional effort over
		and beyond the normal weed maintenance effort required
22		and beyond the normal weed maintenance criter required

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1		for the production or management of certain crops and
2		pasture lands, recreational areas, forest lands, or
3		conservation areas.
4	<u>§152</u>	-F Criteria based on distribution and spread.
5	Distribut	ion and spread criteria of noxious weeds are plant
6	<u>species t</u>	hat are:
7	<u>(1)</u> .	Not known to occur in one or more islands of the
8		State;
9	(2)	Known to occur only in incipient stages on less than
10		five acres on one or more islands of the State; or
11	(3)	Known to occur on more than five acres but only in
12		isolated or limited areas on one or more islands of
13		the State.
14	<u>§152</u>	-G Procedure for the designation of noxious weed by
15	the board	. (a) A study and evaluation of potential noxious
16	weed spec	ies may be initiated by any board member or upon
17	<u>request b</u>	y other governmental agencies or private organizations.
18	(b)	Any board member may recommend the designation of a
19	plant spe	cies as a noxious weed when sufficient data has been
20	accumulat	ed on a plant species to meet the criteria provided in
21	sections	152-B through 152-F.



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1	(c) The board shall issue an order designating a plant
2	species as a noxious weed for an eradication or control project
3	by the department or for a control project by lessees as
4	provided in state pasture lease agreements upon the
5	recommendation of a board member and a two-thirds majority vote
6	of the board members present and voting at a meeting at which
7	there is a quorum.
8	(d) Any board member may submit to the board a request to
9	rescind an official designation of a plant species under section
10	152-A as a noxious weed. The request shall include a report
11	explaining why the plant species no longer meets the criteria of
12	a noxious weed.
13	(e) The board shall issue an order rescinding an official
14	designation of a plant species as a noxious weed upon a two-
15	thirds majority vote of the board members present and voting at
16	a meeting at which there is a quorum."
17	SECTION 4. In codifying the new sections added by section
18	3 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
19	appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
20	the new sections in this Act.
21	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
22	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title: Noxious Weed Control; Noxious Weed List; Board of Agriculture

#### Description:

Authorizes the Board of Agriculture to designate plants as noxious weeds by order, subject to certain requirements.

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
