### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BURGLARY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to hold perpetrators		
strictly liable for burglary of a dwelling if the resident or		
resident's guest is present during the burglary, and to mandate		
a sentence of ten years imprisonment upon conviction.		
SECTION 2. Section 708-810, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
amended to read as follows:		
"§708-810 Burglary in the first degree. (1) A person		
commits the offense of burglary in the first degree if the		
person intentionally enters or remains unlawfully in a building,		
with intent to commit therein a crime against a person or		
against property rights, and:		
(a) The person is armed with a dangerous instrument in the		
course of committing the offense; [ <del>or</del> ]		
(b) The person intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly
