A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The military specialty license plates program
was authorized in 1992, and since that time, the counties have
issued thousands of plates to eligible applicants. This program
serves as an important acknowledgement to our veterans,
recognizing their sacrifice and service to our nation.

6 Veteran license plates identify individuals who have 7 provided a service to this country and are a symbol of the 8 gratitude of the general public. Accordingly, it is important 9 that as many veterans categories as possible are included in the 10 program. Currently, the license plate options are limited and 11 various groups of veterans are not included.

The legislature finds that a number of states have military 12 13 license plate programs that are far more inclusive than Hawaii's. For example, Idaho's selection of plates includes 14 branch of service and the conflict that veterans served in. 15 Idaho also offers license plates for families that have a 16 17 deceased relative who died as a result of hostile action in a Illinois, another state with an expansive military 18 combat zone. 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license plate program, offers twenty-eight plate options, 1 including selections for various medal recipients. 2 The purpose of this Act is to establish a working group on 3 the expansion of the military license plates program to examine 4 5 the State's policy on military specialty license plates. 6 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a working group on 7 the expansion of the military license plates program, to be placed under the office of veterans services for administrative 8 9 purposes. The purpose of the working group on the expansion of 10 (b) the military license plates program shall be to explore the 11 feasibility of providing specialty license plates for all 12 veterans. The working group shall meet a minimum of three 13 times, include outreach to community veterans groups, and shall 14 consider: 15 Specific categories of veterans to be included in the 16 (1)17 program; Reasonable fees for the issuance of the plates, and 18 (2) whether certain categories of veterans should be 19

20 exempt from the fees;

6	(5)	Any other relevant issues.
7	(c)	The working group on the expansion of the military

10	(1)	The director of the office of veterans' services, or
11		the director's designee;
12	(2)	The chair of the advisory board on veterans' services,
13		or the chair's designee;
14	(3)	The chief of police, city and county of Honolulu, or
15		the chief's designee;
16	(4)	The chief of police, county of Hawaii, or the chief's
17		designee;
18	(5)	The chief of police, county of Maui, or the chief's
19		designee;
20	(6)	The chief of police, county of Kauai, or the chief's
21		designee;



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1	(7)	The director of finance, county of Hawaii, or the
2		director's designee;
3	(8)	The director of finance, county of Maui, or the
4		director's designee;
5	(9)	The director of finance, county of Kauai, or the
6		director's designee; and
7	(10)	The director of budget and fiscal services, city and
8		county of Honolulu, or the director's designee.
9	(d)	The office of veterans' services shall convene the
10	meetings	of the working group on the expansion of the military
11	license plates program; provide all administrative, technical,	
12	professional, and clerical support required by the working	
13	group; and draft and submit the report required under subsection	
14	(f).	
15	(e)	Members of the working group on the expansion of the
16	military license plates program shall receive no compensation	
17	for their	services, but may be reimbursed for incidental
18	expenses,	including travel costs, necessary for the performance
19	of their duties under this Act.	
20	(f)	The working group on the expansion of the military
21	license plates program shall report its findings and	
22	recommendations, including any suggested legislation, to the	
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legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
the regular session of 2012.

3 (g) The working group on the expansion of the military4 license plates program shall cease to exist on May 15, 2012.

5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
