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### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHARMACISTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1.	SECTION 1. Chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§461-A Clinical pharmacist practitioner; qualifications.		
5	(a) A cl	inical pharmacist practitioner is a licensed pharmacist	
6	in good standing who:		
7	(1)	Is certified by the board, in concurrence with the	
8		Hawaii medical board, to provide prescription drug	
9		therapy management, including diagnosing, prescribing,	
10		modifying, or discontinuing drug therapies, or	
11		ordering tests under the direction or supervision of a	
12		prescriber; and	
13	(2)	Has additional education, experience, or certification	
14		as required by the board in concurrence with the	
15	·	Hawaii medical board.	
16	<u>(b)</u>	A clinical pharmacist practitioner shall not request,	
17	receive,	or sign for professional controlled substance samples.	



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1	<u>(c)</u> On	ly a pharmacist certified by the board may legally

3	SECTION	2. Section 461-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
4	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted		
5	and to read as follows:		
6	""Clinical pharmacist practitioner" means a licensed		
7	pharmacist in good standing who meets the requirements of		
8	section 461-A."		
9	SECTION 3. Section 461-4.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
10	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

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1 (3)May require the inspection of any wholesale 2 prescription drug distributor premises in the State to 3 ensure compliance with this chapter and rules adopted 4 under this chapter, or may require an applicant for a 5 pharmacy license to submit a statement that the 6 premises, including but not limited to security and 7 sanitation, are in conformance with the board's 8 requirements and that the applicant possesses the 9 reference materials and technical clinical equipment 10 and supplies as may be specified in rules adopted 11 under this chapter; and 12 (4)May fine, suspend, or revoke any license or permit for 13 any cause prescribed by this chapter, or for any 14 violation of the rules adopted under this chapter, and 15 refuse to grant or renew any license or permit for any 16 cause which would be ground for revocation or 17 suspension of a license or permit." 18 SECTION 4. Section 461-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 20 "(c) In the event that the pharmacist or clinical 21 pharmacist practitioner has not engaged in the practice of 22 pharmacy in this State or in another state or territory of the HB LRB 11-0796.doc

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1 United States within the past five years, the board may require 2 the pharmacist to satisfy additional requirements, as specified in rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91, to demonstrate that the 3 4 pharmacist is competent to practice in this State." 5 SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by section 6 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute 7 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating 8 the new sections in this Act. 9
