### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that sexuality health 2 education promotes healthy attitudes on adolescent growth and 3 development, body image, gender and sexuality, dating, relationships, and family. The legislature also finds that 4 5 sexuality health education should positively affect adolescent 6 behavior and provide teens with the information, skills, and 7 support they need to develop positive values, make healthy 8 decisions, and respect the important role that sexuality plays 9 throughout a person's life. Within the past three years, 10 several states, including Hawaii, have enacted laws that require 11 school districts that teach sexuality health education to 12 include age appropriate, medically accurate health education. 13 The legislature finds that the effectiveness of sexuality health 14 education in Hawaii's schools could be bolstered by providing 15 clearer guidance on a comprehensive approach to sexuality health 16 education, greater flexibility in the implementation of the 17 curricula, and greater public access to the curricula.

18 The purpose of this Act is to:



1 (1)Specify additional elements of Hawaii's existing 2 sexuality health education law and implementation of 3 the instruction; 4 (2) Require the department of education to provide 5 information on the curricula to the public; and 6 (3) Allow parents to request that their children not 7 receive the sexuality health education provided 8 pursuant to Hawaii's sexuality health education law. Section 321-11.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 SECTION 2. 10 amended to read as follows: 11 "[+]§321-11.1[+] Medically accurate sexuality health 12 (a) Sexuality health education programs funded by education. 13 the State shall provide medically accurate and factual 14 information that [is]: 15 (1) Is age appropriate [and includes]; 16 (2) Includes education on abstinence, contraception, and 17 methods of disease prevention to prevent unintended 18 pregnancy and sexually transmitted disease, including 19 human immunodeficiency virus [-]; 20 (3) Helps students develop relationships and communication 21 skills to form healthy relationships that are based on



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1		mutual respect and affection and are free from	
2		violence, coercion, and intimidation;	
3	(4)	Helps students develop skills in critical thinking,	
4		problem solving, decision making, and stress	
5		management to make healthy decisions about sexuality	
6		and relationships; and	
7	<u>(5)</u>	Encourages students to communicate with their parents,	
8		guardians, and other trusted adults about sexuality	
9		and intimate relations.	
10	(b)	Each public elementary, secondary, and alternative	
11	school operated by the department of education shall provide		
12	sexuality	health education described under subsection (a).	
13	(c)	At their own discretion, teachers may answer in good	
14	faith any	question initiated by a student or students that is	
15	reasonably	y related to and consistent with the material of a	
16	course pro	ovided pursuant to subsection (a).	
17	(d)	The department of health, in consultation with the	
18	departmen	t of education, may eliminate or modify components of	
19	instructi	on under subsection (a)(2) in elementary school for	
20	reasons of	f age appropriateness.	
21	<u>(e)</u>	Sexuality health education under subsection (a) shall	
22	not discr	iminate on the basis of sex, race, ethnicity, national	
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1	origin, disability, religion, sexual orientation, or gender
2	identity.
3	(f) The department of health, in consultation with the
4	department of education, shall develop, maintain, and make
5	available to the public a current list of sexuality health
6	education curricula that are consistent with the requirements
7	under subsection (a).
8	(g) A student shall be excused from any part of the
9	instruction provided pursuant to this section only upon the
10	written request of the student's parent or legal guardian. A
11	student may not be subject to disciplinary action, academic
12	penalty, or other sanction if the student's parent or legal
13	guardian requests that the student not receive the instruction
14	provided under this section.
15	(h) The department of health shall adopt rules pursuant to
16	chapter 91 necessary to carry out the purposes of this section.
17	The department of health, in consultation with the department of
18	education, shall establish minimum education and training
19	qualifications for sexuality health education teachers.
20	$\left[\frac{b}{1}\right]$ (i) For the purposes of this section:



"Age appropriate" means suitable to a particular age or age
 group based on developing cognitive, emotional, and behavioral
 capacity typical for that age or age group.

4 "Factual information" means medical, psychiatric,
5 psychological, empirical, or statistical information that is
6 verified or supported by research conducted by recognized
7 medical, psychiatric, psychological, and public health
8 professionals or organizations.

9 "Medically accurate" means verified or supported by 10 research conducted in compliance with accepted scientific 11 methods and recognized as accurate and objective by professional organizations and agencies with expertise in the relevant field, 12 13 such as the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 14 the American Public Health Association, the American Academy of 15 Pediatrics, and the American College of Obstetricians and 16 Gynecologists.

17 "Sexuality health education" means education in any medium 18 regarding human development and sexuality, including education 19 on pregnancy, family planning, and sexually transmitted 20 diseases."

21 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
