A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HOMELESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many homeless 1 persons are known to thrive better when they have ready access 2 to familiar support groups or family members. The intent of the 3 return-to-home program is to ensure that those individuals who 4 5 find themselves homeless in the islands are able to reconnect with support networks ready and able to receive them. 6 The purpose of this Act is to establish a return-to-home 7 program for gualified homeless individuals. 8 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to part XVII to be appropriately 10 designated and to read as follows: 11 Return-to-home program. (a) There is 12 "§346established within the department, a voluntary homeless 13 assistance program to be known as the return-to-home program to 14 provide eligible homeless individuals with assistance in being 15

16 reunited with family and relatives in the individual's home

3	(1)	The individual's participation is completely	
4		voluntary;	
5	(2)	The individual has a support system in place in the

8	(3)	The individual, if on parole, probation, or awaiting a	
9		court hearing or sentencing, has proper clearance from	
10		the court to participate in the program; and	
11	(4)	The individual is indigent and lacks the financial	
12		resources necessary to secure transportation to return	
13		to the individual's home state.	
14	(C)	An individual may participate in the return-to-home	
15	program or	nly once and shall sign an agreement to this effect	
16	prior to participating in the program. The agreement shall be		
17	kept on file with the department.		
18	(d)	The department shall actively seek the participation	
19	of local airlines, cruise lines, charter companies, homeless		
20	programs, travel agencies, and the visitor industry to		
21	coordinate and implement the program.

1	(e) The department shall also assist program participants		
2	with necessary and proper preparations for the return trip,		
3	including proper identification, public transportation to the		
4	airport, orientation relating to airport security, the basics of		
5	personal hygiene, and sufficient physical and mental health to		
6	endure a return flight, and shall follow up with each individual		
7	within one month of the individual's return to the individual's		
8	home state to assess efforts at successful reunification with		
9	any family or support system.		
10	(f) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter		
11	91 to develop the return-to-home program and adopt standards for		
12	its implementation."		
13	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
14	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
15	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 to		
16	implement the return-to-home program, including all program		
17	costs and the hiring of necessary staff.		
18	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of		
19	human services for the purposes of this Act.		
20	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.		
21	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
