A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DAM SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 205, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§205- Dams and reservoirs. Dams and related reservoir
5	areas designated as important agricultural lands that are used
6	primarily for:
7	(1) Cultivation of crops, including crops for bioenergy,
8	flowers, vegetables, foliage, fruits, forage, and
9	timber;
10	(2) Game and fish propagation; or
11	(3) Raising of livestock, including poultry, bees, fish,
12	or other animal or aquatic life that are propagated
13	for economic use,
14	shall be eligible for inclusion in the total acreage calculation
15	for important agricultural lands and shall qualify for
16	incentives pursuant to section 205-46; provided that dams and
17	reservoirs classified as important agricultural lands shall not
18	be included in the total acreage calculation for a petition for

4	SECT	ION 2. (a) There is established the dam safety task
5	force, to	be placed within the department of land and natural
6	resources	for administrative purposes only.
7	(b)	The dam safety task force shall consist of the
8	following	members:
9	(1)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
10		resources or the chairperson's designee, who shall
11		serve as the chairperson of the task force;
12	(2)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture or the
13		chairperson's designee;
14	(3)	The attorney general or the attorney general's
15		designee;
16	(4)	The deputy director for water resource management of
17		the department of land and natural resources or the
18		deputy director's designee;
19	(5)	Upon request, a member of the Hawaii Cattlemen's
20		Council, selected by the Council; provided that the
21	+ · · · · · · ·	Council accepts the request;

1	(6)	Upon request, a representative of the Hawaii Farm
2		Bureau Federation, selected by the Federation;
3	•	provided that the Federation accepts the request;
4	(7)	Upon request, an owner of a parcel of agricultural
5		land in the State greater than acres that contains
6		at least one dam, to be selected by the chairperson of
7		the task force; provided that the owner accepts the
8		request; and
9	(8)	Upon request, five persons with specialized knowledge
10		and experience in water resource management and
11		engineering, to be selected by the chairperson of the
12		task force; provided that the individuals accept the
13		request.
14	(c)	The dam safety task force shall review applicable
15	state law	s, administrative rules, and county ordinances and
16	recommend	actions to be taken by the engineering division of the
17	departmen	t of land and natural resources in its administration
18	of the Ha	waii dam safety program.
19	(d)	The members of the dam safety task force shall serve
20	without c	ompensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,
21	including	travel expenses, necessary for the performance of

their duties.

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- 1 (e) The dam safety task force shall report its findings
- 2 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
- 3 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 4 the regular session of 2012.

- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
