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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 324, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending the title of Part II to read as follows:
3	"PART II. MENTAL HEALTH AND [MENTAL RETARDATION] INTELLECTUAL
4	DISABILITY STUDIES"
5	SECTION 2. Chapter 333F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by amending the title to read as follows:
7	"SERVICES FOR PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL [DISABILITIES] OR
8	[MENTAL RETARDATION] INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES"
9	SECTION 3. Section 333F-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
11	"(a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the family
12	court may appoint the director as guardian of any person if the
13	court finds that:
14	(1) The person is an incapacitated person as defined in
15	section 560:5-102;
16	(2) The person is developmentally or intellectually
17	disabled [or mentally retarded];



1 (3)The person may reasonably be expected to need 2 treatment or care at any residential facility; and 3 (4)There is no other suitable guardian including the public guardian as designated in chapter 551A able or 4 5 willing to serve as guardian." 6 SECTION 4. Section 346-230, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 8 "(b) Upon the department's determination that protective 9 services are no longer needed, the vulnerable adult shall be 10 referred to the agency responsible for follow-up services. For 11 the mentally ill[, mentally-retarded, or developmentally 12 disabled-adult,] or adults with developmental or intellectual 13 disabilities, the state agency designated to provide services 14 shall be the department of health." 15 Section 346D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 5. 16 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: "(a) Waiver programs shall be established and administered 17 18 by the department of human services to provide comprehensive 19 home and community-based services for the aged, chronically ill, 20 disabled, developmentally disabled, and [mentally retarded individuals,] individuals with intellectual disabilities, who 21 22 are certified as requiring acute, skilled nursing, intermediate HB LRB 11-0879.doc 2

14	SECTION 8. Section 571-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

16	"§571-11 Jurisdiction; children. Except as otherwise		
17	provided in this chapter, the court shall have exclusive		
18	original jurisdiction in proceedings:		
19	(1) Concerning any person who is alleged to have committed		
20	an act prior to achieving eighteen years of age which		
21	would constitute a violation or attempted violation of		
22	any federal, state, or local law or municipal		
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1		ordinance. Regardless of where the violation
2		occurred, jurisdiction may be taken by the court of
3		the circuit where the person resides, is living, or is
4		found, or in which the offense is alleged to have
5		occurred;
6	(2)	Concerning any child living or found within the
7		circuit:
8		(A) Who is neglected as to or deprived of educational
9		services because of the failure of any person or
10		agency to exercise that degree of care for which
11		it is legally responsible;
12		(B) Who is beyond the control of the child's parent
13		or other custodian or whose behavior is injurious
14		to the child's own or others' welfare;
15		(C) Who is neither attending school nor receiving
16		educational services required by law whether
17		through the child's own misbehavior or
18		nonattendance or otherwise; or
19		(D) Who is in violation of curfew;
20	(3)	To determine the custody of any child or appoint a
21		guardian of any child;
22	(4)	For the adoption of a person under chapter 578;



1	(5)	For the termination of parental rights under sections		
2		571-61 to 571-63;		
3	(6)	For judicial consent to the marriage, employment, or		
4		enlistment of a child, when [such] consent is required		
5		by law;		
6	(7)	For the treatment or commitment of a mentally		
7		defective, [mentally retarded, or] mentally ill		
8		child[+], or a child with an intellectual disability;		
9	(8)	Under the Interstate Compact on Juveniles under		
10		chapter 582 or the Interstate Compact for Juveniles		
11		under chapter 582D;		
12	(9)	For the protection of any child under chapter 587A;		
13		and		
14	(10)	For a change of name as provided in section 574-		
15		5(a)(2)(C)."		
16	SECT	ION 9. Section 46-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
17	amended by substituting the words "individuals with intellectual			
18	disabilities" wherever the words "mentally retarded individuals"			
19	or "mentally retarded" appear, as the context requires.			
20	SECT	ION 10. Sections 46-4 and 518-3, Hawaii Revised		
21	Statutes,	are amended by substituting the words "intermediate		
22	care faci	lity for individuals with intellectual disabilities in		
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1 the community" wherever the words "intermediate care 2 facility/mental retardation-community" appear, as the context 3 requires.

4 SECTION 11. Sections 321-11.5, 321-15.2, 346-29.5, 346-37, 5 346D-2, 346D-3, 346E-1, and 846-2.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 6 are amended by substituting the term "intermediate care facility 7 for individuals with intellectual disabilities" or "intermediate 8 care facilities for individuals with intellectual disabilities" 9 wherever the term "intermediate care facility for the mentally 10 retarded" or "intermediate care facilities for the mentally 11 retarded" appears, as the context requires.

SECTION 12. Sections 321-15.9, 324-11, 328C-1, 333F-1, 333F-22, 431:10-212, 431:10D-212, 431M-1, 432:1-601, and 461-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, are amended by substituting the term "intellectual disability" or "intellectual disabilities" wherever the term "mental retardation" appears, as the context requires.

SECTION 13. Sections 321-15.9, 333F-1, 333F-2, 333F-3,
333F-5, 333F-6, 333F-8, 333F-13, and 333F-22, Hawaii Revised
Statutes, are amended by substituting the words "developmental
or intellectual disabilities" wherever the words "developmental



1 disabilities or mental retardation" appear, as the context
2 requires.

3 SECTION 14. Section 333F-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended by substituting the word "ICF/ID" wherever the word
5 "ICF/MR" appears, as the context requires.

6 SECTION 15. Sections 383-7, 386-1, 392-5, and 393-5,
7 Hawaii Revised Statutes, are amended by substituting the words
8 "developmental and intellectual disabilities" wherever the words
9 "developmental disabilities and mental retardation" appear, as
10 the context requires.

SECTION 16. Section 571-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by substituting the words "individuals with intellectual disabilities" wherever the term "retarded" appears, as the context requires.

15 SECTION 17. Sections 571-61 and 578-2, Hawaii Revised
16 Statutes, are amended by substituting the term "intellectually
17 disabled" wherever the term "mentally retarded" appears, as the
18 context requires.

19 SECTION 18. No later than January 1, 2015, the director of 20 any department affected by the amendments in this Act shall 21 adopt or amend, as necessary, rules, pursuant to chapter 91, to 22 make the terminology and references in the relevant Hawaii



1 Administrative Rules consistent with the amendments to the 2 Hawaii Revised Statutes made by this Act. 3 SECTION 19. This Act is not intended to change the coverage, eligibility, rights, responsibilities or definitions 4 5 referred to in the amended provisions. 6 SECTION 20. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 8 SECTION 21. This Act shall take effect upon its approval; 9 provided that the amendment made to section 321-11.5, Hawaii 10 Revised Statutes, by this Act shall not be repealed when that 11 section is reenacted on June 30, 2014, by section 8 of Act 21, 12 Special Session Laws of Hawaii, 2009. 13
