A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CLEAN AND SOBER HOME AND HALFWAY HOUSE TASK FORCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that clean and sober
- 2 homes and halfway houses are an integral step in the treatment
- 3 of individuals recently released from incarceration and with
- 4 substance abuse issues. Persons released from incarceration
- 5 especially need the support of a home environment while trying
- 6 to deal with the stressors of reintegrating back into society
- 7 while maintaining sobriety. The legislature also finds that
- 8 there is a community concern regarding having these homes in
- 9 their immediate vicinity, and their concerns must be tempered
- 10 with the needs of the individuals requiring support.
 - 11 The purpose of this Act is to establish a task force to
 - 12 determine how clean and sober homes and halfway houses may be
 - 13 regulated, while still meeting all laws protecting people with
 - 14 disabilities.
 - 15 SECTION 2. (a) There is established the clean and sober
 - 16 home and halfway house task force within the department of
 - 17 health for administrative purposes.

- 7 (3) Develop procedures and protocols for making clean and 8 sober homes and halfway houses accountable, yet not 9 requiring formal licensure; and
- 10 (4) Ensure that all recommendations are in compliance with
 11 federal and state housing laws for persons with
 12 disabilities.
- (d) The members of the task force shall select the

 chairperson of the task force from among themselves. Members of

 the task force shall serve without compensation, but shall be

 reimbursed for necessary expenses, including travel expenses,

 incurred in the performance of their official duties.
- (e) The task force shall submit a report of its findingsand recommendations to the legislature no later than twenty daysprior to the convening of the 2012 regular session.
