A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's beekeepers
- 2 are experiencing devastating losses in their industry due to a
- 3 combination of bad weather and the infestation of varroa mites,
- 4 nosema spores, and small hive beetles. Unofficial counts
- 5 indicate that thousands of bee colonies in Hawaii have died off,
- 6 but the exact numbers remain unknown. Currently, state
- 7 agricultural officials do not compile statistics on the
- 8 production of queen bees in Hawaii, in part because the industry
- 9 is small and also because of issues relating to proprietary
- 10 information.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to allow beekeepers to register
- 12 certain information with the department of agriculture, which
- 13 shall be kept confidential except for the name and business
- 14 address of each registrant.
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 142, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 17 and to read as follows:

1	" <u>§142-</u> <u>Beekeepers; registration.</u> (a) Beekeepers may
2	register with the department of agriculture, on forms prescribed
3	and prepared by the department, which shall include the
4	following information:
5	(1) The name, address, and contact information for the
6	beekeeper; and
7	(2) Other information that may assist the department in
8	compiling accurate information on Hawaii's beekeeping
9	industry.
10	(b) The information shall be confidential and the
11	department shall not disclose the information unless otherwise
12	required by law; provided that the name and business address of
13	each registrant shall be made publicly available by the
14	department; and provided further that the department may compile
15	statistics based on the information, pursuant to section 141-1.
16	(c) The registration shall be effective for a period of
17	one year, and shall be renewed at the end of the one-year
18	period."
19	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
21	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and

- 1 year 2012-2013 to establish an apiary program within the
- 2 department of agriculture, including permanent positions as
- 3 follows:
- 4 (1) One apiary specialist;
- 5 (2) One apiary planner; and
- 6 (3) Two apiary technicians.
- 7 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 8 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. The department of agriculture shall report to
- 10 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 11 of the regular session of 2013 on the effectiveness of beekeeper
- 12 registration in keeping accurate statistics on the beekeeping
- 13 industry, including any proposed legislation or recommendations
- 14 for amendments to the registration system or process.
- 15 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
