A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAMPAIGNS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that the State has a
- 2 duty to its citizens to ensure that information concerning
- 3 campaign contributions and expenditures is readily available to
- 4 and easily accessible by the public. Disclosure is even more
- 5 important to the elections process in light of the dramatic
- 6 changes in contributions policy reflected in recent court cases,
- 7 such as Citizens United v. Federal Election Commission, 130
- 8 S.Ct. 876 (U.S. 2010).
- 9 In Hawaii, noncandidate committee reports and
- 10 electioneering communication reports document independent
- 11 campaign expenditures. The purpose of this Act is to increase
- 12 transparency by clarifying reporting requirements for election
- 13 contributions and expenditures and to require all entities,
- 14 except individuals, to register as noncandidate committees and
- 15 to comply with established reporting requirements.
- 16 SECTION 2. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 17 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 18 read as follows:

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1	"§11- Campaign contributions; noncandidate committees.
2	A person who makes contributions or expenditures in an aggregate
3	amount of \$1,000 or more in a two-year election period to
4	influence the nomination for election, the election of any
5	candidate to political office, or for or against any issue on
6	the ballot, shall register as a noncandidate committee. For
7	purposes of this section, "person" does not include an
8	individual.
9	<u>S11-</u> <u>Late expenditures; report.</u> (a) The authorized
10	person that is a party or treasurer, in the case of a
11	noncandidate committee, that makes expenditures aggregating more
12	than \$500 fourteen calendar days through four calendar days
13	prior to any election shall file a late expenditures report by
14	means of the commission's electronic filing system on or before
15	the third calendar day prior to the election.
16	(b) The late expenditures report shall include the
17	information required in section 11-335(b)(2) and 11-335(b)(3).
18	(c) A late expenditures report filed pursuant to this
19	section shall be in addition to any other report required to be
20	filed by this part."
21	SECTION 3. Section 11-302, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
22	amended is amended by amending the definitions of "candidate
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committee", "expenditure", "noncandidate committee", and 1 "treasurer" to read as follows: 2 ""Candidate committee" means an organization, association, **3** . person, or individual that receives campaign funds, makes 4 expenditures, or incurs financial obligations on behalf of a 5 6 candidate with the candidate's authorization. 7 "Expenditure" means: Any purchase or transfer of money or anything of 8 (1) value, or promise or agreement to purchase or transfer 9 money or anything of value, or payment incurred or 10 made, or the use or consumption of a nonmonetary 11 contribution for the purpose of: 12 Influencing the nomination for election, or the 13 (A) 14 election, of any person seeking nomination for election or election to office, whether or not 15 the person has filed the person's nomination 16 17 papers; (B) Influencing the outcome of any question or issue 18 19 that has been certified to appear on the ballot 20 at the next applicable election; or (C) Use by any party for the purposes set out in 21

subparagraph (A) or (B);

1	(2)	Any payment, by any person other than a candidate,
2		candidate committee, or noncandidate committee, of
3		compensation for the services of another person that
4		are rendered to the candidate, candidate committee, or
5		noncandidate committee for any of the purposes
6		mentioned in paragraph (1)(A); provided that payment
7	•	under this paragraph shall include provision of
8		services without charge; or
9	(3)	The expenditure by a candidate of the candidate's own
10		funds for the purposes set out in paragraph (1)(A).
11	"Expe	enditure" does not include:
12	(1)	Services voluntarily provided without compensation by
13		individuals to or on behalf of a candidate, candidate
14		committee, or noncandidate committee;
15	(2)	Voter registration efforts that are nonpartisan; or
16	(3)	An individual[, candidate committee, or noncandidate
17		committee] engaging in internet activities for the
18		purpose of influencing an election if:
19		(A) The individual[, candidate committee, or
20		nencandidate committee] is uncompensated for
21		internet activities; or

1	(B) The individual[, candidate committee, or
2	noncandidate committee] uses equipment or
3	services for uncompensated internet activities,
4	regardless of who owns the equipment and
5	services;
6	provided that the internet activity exclusion does not
7	apply to any payment for an advertisement other than a
8	nominal fee; the purchase or rental of an electronic
9	address list made at the direction of a candidate
10	committee or noncandidate committee; or an electronic
11	mail address list that is transferred to a candidate
12	committee or noncandidate committee.
13	"Noncandidate committee" means an organization,
14	association, party, person, or individual that has the purpose
15	of making or receiving contributions, making expenditures, or
16	incurring financial obligations to influence the nomination for
17	election, or the election, of any candidate to office, or for or
18	against any question or issue on the ballot; provided that a
19	noncandidate committee does not include:
20	(1) A candidate committee;
21	(2) Any individual making a contribution or making an
22	expenditure of the individual's own funds or anything

1	of value that the individual originally acquired for
2	the individual's own use and not for the purpose of
3	evading any provision of this part; or
4	(3) Any organization that raises or expends funds for the
5	sole purpose of producing and disseminating
6	informational or educational communications that are
7	not made to influence the outcome of an election,
8	question, or issue on a ballot.
9	"Treasurer" means [a person] an individual appointed under
10	section 11-324 and unless expressly indicated otherwise,
11	includes deputy treasurers."
12	SECTION 4. Section 11-335, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
14	"(b) Schedules filed with the reports shall include the
15	following additional information:
16	(1) The amount and date of deposit of each contribution
17	and the name, address, occupation, and employer of
18	each contributor making a contribution aggregating
19	more than \$100 during an election period, which was
20	not previously reported; provided that if all the
21	information is not on file, the contribution shall be

1		returned to the contributor within thirty days of
2		deposit;
3	(2)	The amount and date of each contribution made and the
4		name and address of the candidate committee or
5		noncandidate committee to which the contribution was
6		made;
7	[(2)]	(3) All expenditures, including the name and address
8		of each payee and the amount, date, and purpose of
9		each expenditure. Expenditures for consultants,
10		advertising agencies and similar firms, credit card
11		payments, salaries, and candidate reimbursements shall
12		be itemized to permit a reasonable person to determine
13		the ultimate intended recipient of the expenditure and
14		its purpose; provided that the purpose of an
15		independent expenditure shall include the name of the
16		candidate or candidates that are supported or opposed
17		by the expenditure and whether the expenditure
18		supports or opposes the candidate or candidates;
19	[-(3)-]	(4) The amount, date of deposit, and description of
20		other receipts and the name and address of the source
21		of each of the other receipts;

1 $[\frac{4}{4}]$ (5) A description of each durable asset, the date of 2 acquisition, value at the time of acquisition, and the 3 name and address of the vendor or contributor of the 4 asset; and 5 $[\frac{(5)}{(5)}]$ (6) The date of disposition of a durable asset, value 6 at the time of disposition, method of disposition, and 7 name and address of the person receiving the asset." 8 SECTION 5. Section 11-336, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 10 The filing dates for preliminary reports are: Ten calendar days prior to the first day that walk-in 11 (1) 12 ballots are accepted for a primary, special, or nonpartisan election; and 13 14 (2) Ten calendar days prior to the first day that walk-in 15 ballots are accepted for a general election. 16 Each preliminary report shall be current through the fifth 17 calendar day prior to the filing of the report." 18 SECTION 6. Section 11-341, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 amended to read as follows: 20 "[{]\$11-341[}] Electioneering communications; statement of 21 information. 2		communications pertain and the names, if known, of the
3		candidates identified or to be identified;
4	[-(5)-]	(6) If the disbursements were made by a candidate
5 .		committee or noncandidate committee, the names and
6		addresses of all persons who contributed to the
7		candidate committee or noncandidate committee for the
8		purpose of publishing or broadcasting the
9		electioneering communications;
10	[-(6) -]	(7) If the [disbursements were] disbursement was made
11		by an organization other than a candidate committee or
12		noncandidate committee, the names and addresses the
13		entities, and the names, addresses, occupations, and
14		employers of all [persons] individuals who contributed
15		to the organization for the purpose of publishing or
16		broadcasting the electioneering communications[; and],
17		or if the disbursement was made from the general
18		treasury of the entity, the names and addresses of all
19		persons who contributed to the general treasury funds
20		designated for use as a campaign contribution during
21		the twelve months prior to making the disbursement;

2	is made in coordination, cooperation, or concert with
3	or at the request or suggestion of any candidate,
4	candidate committee, or noncandidate committee, or
5	agent of any candidate if any, and if so, the
6	identification of the candidate, a candidate committee
7	or a noncandidate committee, or agent involved.
8	(c) For purposes of this section:
9	"Disclosure date" means, for every calendar year, the first
10	date by which a person has made disbursements during that same
11	year of more than \$2,000 in the aggregate for electioneering
12	communications, and the date of any subsequent disbursements by
13	that person for electioneering communications.
14	"Electioneering communication," means any advertisement that
15	is broadcast from a cable, satellite, television, or radio
16	broadcast station; published in any periodical or newspaper; or
17	sent by mail at a bulk rate, and that:
18	(1) Refers to a clearly identifiable candidate;
19	(2) Is made, or scheduled to be made, either within thirty
20	days prior to a primary or initial special election or
21	within sixty days prior to a general or special
22	election; and

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1	(3)	Is not susceptible to any reasonable interpretation
2		other than as an appeal to vote for or against a
3		specific candidate.
4	"Ele	ctioneering communication" shall not include
5	communica	tions:
6	(1)	In a news story or editorial disseminated by any
7		broadcast station or publisher of periodicals or
. 8		newspapers, unless the facilities are owned or
9		controlled by a candidate, candidate committee, or
10		noncandidate committee;
11	(2)	That constitute expenditures by the disbursing
12		organization;
13	(3)	In house bulletins; or
14	(4)	That constitute a candidate debate or forum, or solely
15		promote a debate or forum and are made by or on behalf
16		of the person sponsoring the debate or forum.
17	(d)	For purposes of this section, a person shall be
18	treated a	s having made a disbursement if the person has executed
19	a contrac	t to make the disbursement.
20	<u>(e)</u>	All reports required to be filed under this section
21	shall be	filed on the commission's electronic filing system."

SECTION 7. Section 11-332, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 repealed. ["[\$11-332] Filing report by corporations. (a) A 3 4 corporation shall file a report with the commission for 5 contributions from its own treasury that aggregate more than 6 \$1,000 per two year election period made directly to a candidate or candidate committee; provided that this section shall not 7 authorize contributions to a candidate or candidate committee 8 9 where otherwise prohibited by this part. The reporting shall be 10 made pursuant to the time requirements contained in section 11-11 336 and section 11-338. 12 (b) The filing shall include the name of the corporation, 13 business address, a contact individual, and amounts contributed 14 that are more than \$100 to each candidate or candidate 15 committee."] SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 16 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 18 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 19
