A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State department 2 of transportation needs to be provided with the flexibility and 3 power to correct apparent inequities in the process of awarding 4 long-term leases for helicopter operations at its Lihue airport. 5 In the past, the department found itself with too few 6 helicopter sites and too many parties interested in using these 7 sites, particularly those at its Lihue airport. Thus, the 8 department offered such sites by bid through a process that 9 allowed the more senior helicopter operators to select first 10 among the available sites. Any company not among the more 11 senior operators was allowed to select from among the remaining available sites. 12

Per discussions with the department, all operators were to enter into a long-term lease with the department with the understanding other interested operators would do likewise.
Among other things, these leases required the operator to construct facilities at the site at their own cost.

1 select sites, which left many sites without any long-term lease. 2 This resulted in an imbalance among helicopter operators because 3 those that entered into long-term leases were burdened by costs 4 associated with having to construct facilities at the helicopter 5 sites, as well as other operational costs while other competing 6 operators were allowed to operate on month to month permits 7 without having to incur such costs. 8 The legislature finds that in view of the department 9 falling significantly short of its expectations of leasing all 10 of its sites on a long-term basis and given the resulting 11 inequities to any operator now burdened with a long-term lease, 12 the department and governor should have the power, authority, 13 and discretion to correct such inequity by, among other things, 14 allowing any operator with a long-term lease to: 15 (1) Terminate its lease; 16 (2) Adjust various leasing requirements including 17 construction requirements; or 18 (3) Rebid on sites still available for lease. 19 Further, the legislature finds and recognizes that the 20 department realizes financial and other benefits from helicopter operators willing to enter into such long-term leases and build 21 facilities at their own expense on the leased sites. 22

3 (2) Shall have the discretion and authority, without 4 limitation, to reach relief by mutual agreement with 5 an operator to terminate the lease, extend the long-6 term lease or contract, enter into a long-term lease 7 or contract for an adjoining helicopter site, switch 8 helicopter sites; provided that the site is not 9 currently on a long-term lease, grant or modify any 10 existing relief provisions, adjust rent, and otherwise 11 add to, modify, and amend any of the terms of the 12 long-term lease or contract; provided that in granting 13 relief pursuant to this Act other than termination of 14 any existing long-term lease or contract, the 15 department in providing relief shall set a rent that 16 is fair and equitable when compared to rent being paid 17 by similar operations that may be operating on a 18 month-to-month permit basis without any requirement to 19 build at its expense any capital or other improvements 20 at one or more of the operator's sites.

21 SECTION 3. The relief provided for by this Act shall be22 provided as long as, and to the extent that, such relief does



not violate any applicable federal laws and regulations and does not jeopardize the receipt of any federal aid or impair the obligation of Hawaii's department of transportation to the holders of any bond issued by Hawaii's department of transportation.

6 SECTION 4. To the extent necessary to take action, 7 effectuate, and fulfill the purpose and intentions of this Act 8 including the relief to be provided, the effects of section 9 171-13, and chapters 102 and 261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as 10 well as any other statutory provisions or any rules that may be 11 in conflict with this Act, shall be deemed waived and not 12 applicable.

SECTION 5. If any provision of this Act, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act, which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
