### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to allow home school
- 2 students, who would otherwise be denied the opportunity to do
- 3 so, to participate on an equal basis in extracurricular
- 4 activities offered at schools.
- 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 7 and to read as follows:
- 8 "\$302A- Home school students; extracurricular
- 9 activities. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, each
- 10 public school, subject to the requirements of this section,
- 11 shall allow any home school student to participate on an equal
- 12 basis in any extracurricular activity offered by a public school
- 13 to enrolled students.
- 14 (b) Each private school may allow a student to participate
- 15 in an extracurricular activity offered by the private school, at
- 16 the private school's discretion.

1	<u>(c)</u>	A public school shall not adopt or agree to be bound	
2	by any ru	le or policy of any organization or association that	
3	would pro	hibit any participation allowed by this section.	
4	<u>(d)</u>	A home school student's participation in an	
5	extracurricular activity through any amateur association or		
6	league of which the public school is not a member shall not		
7	prevent the student from participating or affect the student's		
8	eligibility to participate in the same extracurricular activity		
9	at any public school; provided that prior to participating in		
10	any extracurricular activity through any such amateur		
11	association or league, the student shall obtain the express		
12	written permission of the principal of the public school at		
13	which the	student participates in the extracurricular activity,	
14	which per	mission shall be granted if:	
15	(1)	The student's class attendance is not compromised; and	
16	(2)	The student is in good academic standing under the	
17		home school's activities policy.	
18	(e)	Notwithstanding any rule adopted or agreed to by any	
19	public school, any home school student who is sanctioned or is		
20	found by the public school, or any organization or association		
21	to which the school belongs, to be ineligible to participate in		
22	any extra	curricular activity for any reason, except for	
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Ŧ	unsports	anlike conduct or ejection from an activity, may appear	
2	the sanct	ion or finding. The appeal shall be made through the	
3	applicabl	e process at the school, any league to which the school	
4	belongs,	or any other organization to which the school belongs.	
5	<u>(f)</u>	To participate in an extracurricular activity at a	
6	public so	thool, a home school student shall meet all of the	
7	requireme	ents imposed by the public school, including compliance	
8	with:		
9	(1)	All laws governing the activity;	
10	(2)	All eligibility requirements imposed by the public	
11		school;	
12	<u>(3)</u>	The same responsibilities and standards of behavior as	
13		are imposed on other students participating in the	
14		activity at the public school; and	
15	(4)	The payment of all required activity-related fees,	
16		including any fee provided in subsection (g).	
17	<u>(g)</u>	A public school may charge a home school student a	
18	participa	tion fee as a prerequisite to participation in an	
19	extracurr	icular activity. The fee shall not exceed one hundred	
20	fifty per	cent of the fee amount the school would charge an	
21	enrolled	student to participate in the extracurricular activity;	
22	provided that any fee collected pursuant to this subsection		
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shall be used to fund the particular extracurricular activity
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    for which it is charged and shall not be expended for any other
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    purpose.
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         (h) Home school students who participate in an
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    extracurricular activity in a public school shall be included in
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    the pupil enrollment of the public school where the student

         (i) As used in this section:
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         "Extracurricular activity" means a school-authorized or
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    education-related activity occurring during or outside the
11
    regular instructional school day, including but not limited to
    sports, cheerleading, music, band, clubs, driver's education,

    and after-school programs.

         "Home school" means the sequential program of instruction
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    for the education of a child which:
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         (1) Takes place in a home;
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         (2) Is provided by the child's parent or guardian or by an
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              adult relative of the child designated by the parent
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              or quardian;
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         (3) Is not under the supervision and control of a public
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              school;
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1	(4)	Is not intended to be and does not qualify as a
2		private and nonprofit school or a new century charter
3		school; and
4	(5)	Is subject to any rule adopted by the department of
5		education under title 8, chapter 12, Hawaii
6		Administrative Rules ("compulsory attendance
7		exceptions"), relating to home schooling.
8	<u>(j)</u>	The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
9	<u>91 to adm</u>	inister and implement this section."
