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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 302A-251, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is						
2	amended to read as follows:						
3	"[+]§302A-251[+] School year; instructional time. (a)						
4	otwithstanding any other law to the contrary, $[for]$ beginning						
5	with the 2011-2013 school years, all public schools, [except]						
6	excluding charter schools $[\tau]$ and multi-track public schools,						
7	shall implement a school year of one hundred eighty days,						
8	excluding professional development days and other non-						
9	instructional days negotiated pursuant to chapter 89[, that						
10	shall include:						
11	(1) Nine hundred fifteen student instructional hours for						
12	the elementary school grades; and						
13	(2) Nine-hundred ninety-student-instructional hours-for						
14	the secondary school grades].						
15	(b) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary:						
16	(1) For the 2011-2012 school year, fifty per cent of all						
17	public elementary schools in the State, excluding						
18	charter schools and multi-track public schools, shall						



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1		implement a school year that includes nine hundred					
2	fifteen student instructional hours; and						
3	(2) Beginning with the 2012-2013 school year, all public						
4	elementary schools in the State, excluding charter						
5	<u>i</u>	schools and multi-track public schools, shall					
6	-	implement a school year that includes nine hundred					
7	-	fifteen student instructional hours.					
8	<u>(c)</u>	Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, for the					
9	2014-2016	school years, all public secondary schools, excluding					
10	charter sc	hools and multi-track public schools, shall implement					
11	a school year that includes nine hundred ninety student						
12	instructional hours.						
13	$\left[\frac{b}{a}\right]$ (d) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,						
14	for the [ <del>2</del>	013-2015] 2016-2018 school years, all public schools,					
15	[except] excluding charter schools[7] and multi-track public						
16	<u>schools,</u> sl	hall implement a school year of one hundred eighty					
17	days, excluding professional development days and other non-						
18	instruction	nal days negotiated pursuant to chapter 89, that shall					
19	include on	e thousand eighty student instructional hours for both					
20	elementary	and secondary school grades.					
21	<u>(e)</u>	The board, in its discretion, may grant a waiver to					
22	any indivi	dual school subject to the student instructional hours					
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1	or one hundred eighty day school year requirements in this						
2	section. The board shall adopt policies and procedures to grant						
3	a waiver under this subsection.						
4	$\left[\frac{1}{(c)}\right]$ (f) For purposes of this section, "student						
5	instructional hours" means student learning time during which						
6	students are engaged in learning activities including regularly-						
7	scheduled instruction and learning assessments within the						
8	curriculum, and does not include lunch, recess, or passing time.						
9	(g) The department of education, with the board of						
10	education and office of the governor, and in consultation with						
11	representatives of the affected collective bargaining units,						
12	shall submit to the legislature no later than twenty days prior						
13	to the convening of the regular sessions of 2013, 2014, 2015,						
14	2016, 2017, and 2018, a report on its progress and efforts to						
15	meet the requirements of subsections (a), (b), (c), and (d)."						
16	SECTION 2. Act 167, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, is						
17	amended by amending section 4 to read as follows:						
<b>18</b> `	"SECTION 4. The department of education shall, with the						
19	board of education and office of the governor, and in						
20	consultation with representatives of the affected collective						
21	bargaining units, submit to the legislature, no later than						
22	twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of						
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1	[ <del>2012,</del> ] <u>2015,</u> a plan to implement <u>beginning with the 2018-2019</u>						
2	school year, for elementary and secondary school grades at all						
3	public schools, excluding charter schools and multi-track public						
4	schools, a school year of one hundred ninety days, excluding						
5	professional development days and other non-instructional days						
6	negotiated pursuant to chapter 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that						
7	shall include one thousand one hundred forty student						
8	instructional hours [for both-elementary and secondary school						
9	grades at all public schools, except charter schools, for school						
10	years beginning with the 2015 2016 school year].						
11	For purposes of this section, "student instructional hours"						
12	shall have the same meaning as in section $[302A, ]$ 302A-251,						
13	Hawaii Revised Statutes."						
14	SECTION 3. The department of education shall:						
15	(1) Re-examine what constitutes student instructional						
16	hours, determine current levels of student						
17	instructional hours at each school, and assess the						
18	ability of all schools to comply with the requirements						
19	of section 302A-251(a),(b), and (c), Hawaii Revised						
20	Statutes; and						
21	(2) Report its findings under paragraph (1) to the						

legislature no later than September 1, 2011.

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1	SECTION 4	. Statu	tory material	to be	repealed	is	bracketed

3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
