A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Global natural farming is an agricultural
 methodology developed and refined over the past fifty years by
- 3 Han Kyu Cho of the Republic of Korea. Cho's techniques have
- 4 been demonstrated world-wide in more than thirty countries as a
- 5 viable method of agricultural production without the use of
- 6 conventional and imported pesticides and fertilizers.
- 7 Cho's global natural farming is a distinctive approach to
- 8 organic farming that utilizes local natural farm resources and
- 9 indigenous microorganisms. It involves the propagation of
- 10 mycorrhizae along with protocols for adding specific nutritional
- 11 inputs during critical growth stages of plants. The inputs are
- 12 not only safe for the environment, but they actually
- 13 rehabilitate the ecology.
- 14 In addition to the promotion of environmental protection,
- 15 global natural farming has numerous, more tangible benefits.
- 16 There are currently six acres of land in Waianae, Oahu being
- 17 used for the natural farming of Vietnamese taro and Thai basil.

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- 1 product quality has been improved, product yields have
- 2 increased, and production costs and water consumption have been
- 3 reduced.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 5 agriculture to establish a program to award grants to farmers
- 6 who implement natural farming.
- 7 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 8 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 9 as follows:
- 10 "CHAPTER
- 11 NATURAL FARMING GRANT PROGRAM
- 12 § -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
- "Agricultural producer" has the same meaning as defined in
- 14 section 155-5.6.
- 15 "Department" means the department of agriculture.
- 16 § -2 Natural farming grant program established. The
- 17 department shall establish a natural farming grant program,
- 18 under which the department shall award grants to qualified
- 19 agricultural producers who utilize the Cho global natural
- 20 farming methodology. The department shall accept applications,
- 21 on forms prescribed and prepared by the department, from

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1 agricultural producers to qualify for receipt of the grants, 2 provided that: 3 The applicant is an agricultural producer; (1)4 (2) The applicant has implemented or demonstrates to the 5 department's satisfaction that the applicant intends 6 to implement the Cho global natural farming 7 methodology; 8 (3) The grant shall not exceed per cent of the 9 applicant's total agricultural production costs or 10 exceed \$ in any year; and 11 The department may request that an applicant provide (4) 12 any information, including general excise and income 13 tax returns, it deems necessary to verify the 14 agricultural production costs incurred by any 15 applicant in any year. 16 -3 Rules. The department shall adopt rules, pursuant **17** to chapter 91, to implement this chapter. 18 S -4 Exemption from chapter 42F. The provisions of 19 chapter 42F shall not apply to the grants made pursuant to this chapter, but all grants shall be made only in accordance with 20

standards and conditions specified in section -2."

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1	SECTION 3. Section 42F-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3.	"[$\{-\}$] §42F-102[$\{-\}$] Applications for grants and subsidies.		
4	[Requests] Except for grants awarded under chapter ,		
5	requests for grants and subsidies shall be submitted to the		
6	appropriate standing committees of the legislature at the start		
7	of each regular session of the legislature. Each request shall		
8	state:		
9	(1) The name of the requesting organization;		
10	(2) The public purpose for the grant or subsidy;		
11	(3) The services to be supported by the grant or subsidy;		
12	(4) The target group; and		
13	(5) The cost of the grant or subsidy and the budget."		
14	SECTION 4. Section 42F-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
15	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
16	"(a) [Grants] Except for grants awarded under chapter		
17	, grants and subsidies shall be awarded only to individuals		
18	who, and organizations that:		
19	(1) Are licensed or accredited, in accordance with		
20	federal, state, or county statutes, rules, or		
21	ordinances, to conduct the activities or provide the		
22	services for which a grant or subsidy is awarded;		



1	(2)	Comply with all applicable federal and state laws	
2		prohibiting discrimination against any person on the	
3		basis of race, color, national origin, religion,	
4		creed, sex, age, sexual orientation, or disability;	
5	(3)	Agree not to use state funds for entertainment or	
6		lobbying activities; and	
7	(4)	Allow the state agency to which funds for the grant or	
8		subsidy were appropriated for expenditure, legislative	
9		committees and their staff, and the auditor full	
10		access to their records, reports, files, and other	
11		related documents and information for purposes of	
12		monitoring, measuring the effectiveness, and ensuring	
13	•	the proper expenditure of the grant or subsidy."	
14	SECT	ION 5. There is appropriated out of the general	
15	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much	
16	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and the		
17	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year		
18	2012-2013 for the natural farming grant program established by		
19	this Act.		
20	The	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department	
21	of agricu	lture for the purposes of this Act.	

1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
