A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Global natural farming is an agricultural
methodology developed and refined over the past fifty years by
Han Kyu Cho of the Republic of Korea. Cho's techniques have
been demonstrated world-wide in more than thirty countries as a
viable method of agricultural production without the use of
conventional and imported pesticides and fertilizers.

7 Cho's global natural farming is a distinctive approach to 8 organic farming that uses local natural farm resources and 9 indigenous microorganisms. It involves the propagation of 10 mycorrhizae along with protocols for adding specific nutritional 11 inputs during critical growth stages of plants. The inputs are 12 not only safe for the environment, but they actually 13 rehabilitate the ecology.

In addition to the promotion of environmental protection, global natural farming has numerous, more tangible benefits. There are currently six acres of land in Waianae, Oahu, being used for the natural farming of Vietnamese taro and Thai basil. 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.1 product quality has been improved, product yields have 2 increased, and production costs and water consumption have been 3 reduced. 4 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of 5 agriculture to establish a program to award grants to farmers 6 who implement natural farming. 7 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 8 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 9 as follows: 10 CHAPTER 11 NATURAL FARMING GRANT PROGRAM 12 -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter: S 13 "Agricultural producer" has the same meaning as defined in 14 section 155-5.6. 15 "Department" means the department of agriculture. 16 S Natural farming grant program established. -2 The 17 department shall establish a natural farming grant program, 18 under which the department shall award grants to qualified 19 agricultural producers who use the Cho global natural farming 20 methodology. The department shall accept applications, on forms 21 prescribed and prepared by the department, from agricultural 22 producers to qualify for receipt of the grants, provided that: HB947 HD1 HMS 2011-1919

12	SECTION 4. Section 42F-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
13	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
14	"(a) [Grants] <u>Except for grants awarded under chapter</u>		
15	, grants and subsidies shall be awarded only to individuals		
16	who, and organizations that:		
17	(1) Are licensed or accredited, in accordance with		
18	federal, state, or county statutes, rules, or		
19	ordinances, to conduct the activities or provide the		
20	services for which a grant or subsidy is awarded;		
21	(2) Comply with all applicable federal and state laws		
22	prohibiting discrimination against any person on the		
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1 basis of race, color, national origin, religion, 2 creed, sex, age, sexual orientation, or disability; 3 (3) Agree not to use state funds for entertainment or 4 lobbying activities; and 5 (4) Allow the state agency to which funds for the grant or 6 subsidy were appropriated for expenditure, legislative 7 committees and their staff, and the auditor full 8 access to their records, reports, files, and other 9 related documents and information for purposes of 10 monitoring, measuring the effectiveness, and ensuring 11 the proper expenditure of the grant or subsidy." SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 12 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and the 15 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the natural farming grant program established by 16 17 this Act. 18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department of agriculture for the purposes of this Act. 19

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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
